Community Assistance Program FY09 First Quarter Report

This report cross-references the FY09 CAP-SSSE Program Guidance. Work performed during the first quarter (October through September, 2009) is given below.

1. Ordinance Assistance: Ordinance assistance was provided during a visit to Routt County and general assistance was provided via telephone and incorporated in CAV's performed on an on-going basis.
2. Community Assistance Visits (CAV's) - Visits during this quarter included: Town of Ignacio, La Plata County, City of Durango, City of Craig, and Town of South Fork.
3. Entering Floodplain Management Data in the Community Information Database (CIS): The CWCB is continuing to enter this information on an ongoing basis. The CIS should be up to date with the CAVs performed during this quarter.
4. Workshops and Other Training: Attended the ASFPM Floodproofing Conference in New Orleans and the Community Rating System Workshop in Longmont on November 12th. Participated in the statewide Community Rating System (CRS) committee meeting on October 2nd.
5. Provide regulatory, administrative, mapping and general technical assistance to Colorado's NFIP communities on an as-needed basis.
6. Mapping Assistance: Participate in upcoming scoping meetings, final meetings, and assist with ordinance updates on an on-going basis. Attended the final meeting for Archuleta County on October 8th.
7. Coordination with Other State Agencies: Coordinate with the Office of Emergency Management to manage Flood Mitigation Assistance grants for participating local communities. The granting agency for the Colorado FMA program has been transferred from CWCB to the Colorado Division of

Emergency Management (CDEM). CWCB will continue to provide technical assistance and related efforts to support CDEM and the local applicants on future applications. Mitigation assistance was provided during visits to the Town of Severance and the City of Windsor.

8. Assistance to Communities in Responding to Disasters: No work has been performed since no disasters have been declared.
