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CWCB approves water loans

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, Colo. - The Colorado Water Conservation Board approved three new loans from the Construction Fund totaling nearly \$2 million and one increase to an existing loan at its monthly meeting on Sept. 15.

The Water Supply Planning & Finance Section exists to develop Colorado's water resources by promoting the appropriate development of Colorado's water, and wise and efficient use of Colorado's limited water resources. The CWCB's Water Supply Planning and Finance Section is responsible for managing the Water Project Loan Program and the Non-Reimbursable Project Investments Program. Low interest loans are available to qualified borrowers for raw water projects that develop and/or preserve waters Statewide.

The recently approved loans cover a broad range of water activities. Two project loans will help address dam safety concerns; one in the South Platte River Basin and one in the Colorado River Basin. Two agricultural applicants received loans totaling over \$1.5 million. One of the agricultural loans was to address augmentation needs along the South Platte River and the other was a canal lining project to reduce salinity loading into the Colorado River.
