Watershed & Flood Protection/Water Conservation and Drought Planning

Section - Spring Drought and Flood Outlook

Staff Recommendation: This is an informational item only. No Board action is required.

Background:

The 2011 Water Year began October 2010 and runs through September 2011. So far it has brought mixed conditions to the State. The eastern plains have received well below normal precipitation and the region is currently designated in drought conditions ranging from D0 (abnormally dry) to D2 (drought- severe). However, much of the State's west slope has received average or above average precipitation in the form of snow, especially in the northern mountains.

Staff will present the latest information on both drought and flood conditions and outlooks for the coming weeks and months. Information on snowpack, reservoir levels, stream flows, potential response actions and related topics will be presented. Klaus Wolter of the University of Colorado will present his long-term forecast for the region and discuss possible impacts from the current La Nina event impacting Colorado's weather patterns.

A joint meeting of the Water Availability Task Force and the Flood Task Force will be held on March 17, 2011. For the latest monthly Drought Update, with detailed drought information, please see the March Directors Report. Also, daily flood threat bulletins will be available on the CWCB website during the Colorado flood season.
