

DOLORES WATER CONSERVANCY DISTRICT DOVE CREEK DUAL WATER SYSTEM



Project Description

The Dolores Project provides irrigation, municipal and industrial (M&I) water to areas of Dolores and Montezuma County, including the City of Cortez, Town of Dove Creek, Towpac and sounding rural communities. Following completion of the Dolores Project, the Town of Dove Creek explored alternatives for a more cost effective raw water supply for outside irrigation, resulting in a franchise agreement adopted by the Town on July 11, 2002. The agreement granted the Dolores Water Conservancy District (DWCD) the non-exclusive right to sell and distribute raw water to the Town.

This project provided funding to DWCD, for the construction of a dual raw water supply. A grant from the Department of Local Affairs assisted in making this project financially feasible.
