#### **Staff Recommendation**

Staff recommends that the Board authorize staff to modify and update the Operations and Maintenance Manual for the Chatfield Downstream Channel Improvement Project in partnership with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and local agencies to balance flood control, stream ecosystem function, and recreational objectives.

#### **Background**

The CWCB is the non federal sponsor of the Chatfield Downstream Channel Improvement Project (Project). State and Federal funding was used to straighten the South Platte River downstream of Chatfield Reservoir and line the banks with rip rap to accommodate a 5,000 cfs maximum reservoir release. A 1990 Operations and Maintenance (O&M) manual outlines the role of the CWCB as non-federal sponsor. The enitre project is six miles in length. The upstream two miles is a floodplain park called South Platte Park and not owned by the CWCB. Agenda Item Ten at this board meeting is a Fish and Wildlife Resources Mitigation Fund request by partners in this master planning effort. Moving downstream, the next four miles of river and adjacent parcels are owned by the CWCB. This reach is within Littleton, Englewood, and Sheridan in Arapahoe County.

#### **Discussion**

In 2007, the South Platte Working Group (SPWG) was formed. It consisted of local communities, the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District (UDFCD), CWCB, and the U.S Army Corps of Engineers. Together, the group completed twenty projects, including land acquisition, trails, urban renewal, and open space. In 2012, SPWG II was formed with the focus on the South Platte River and projects that enhance ecology, integrity, recreation, and economic development while maintaining flood conveyance. Staff believes that Corps approvals for these proposed projects can be secured based on interactions with Corps staff.

Staff will give an introduction of the Project, UDFCD will present constructed and planned projects within the reach, and the communities will present the vision for the river. If successful, this flood control project will also become an amenity while still honoring longstanding agreements with the Corps for operations and maintenance.
