## 2:00 WildEarth Guardians Presentation

Bryan Bird will discuss a proposal to designate critical trout waters under the Outstanding Waters provision of the federal Clean Water Act in Water Quality Control Commission Regulations 31.8(2)(a). T he streams include the mainstem of South Fork of the Williams Fork, including all wetlands and tributaries, which are within the Routt National Forest; the mainstem of Beaver Creek, including all wetlands and tributaries, which are within the Routt National Forest; the mainstems of Lost Creek, Snell Creek and Fawn Creeks, including all wetlands and tributaries, from the Flat Tops Wilderness area to the boundary of the White River National Forest; North Elk Creek, including all wetlands and tributaries, from its source to the White River National Forest boundary. Also, the mainstem of Cattle Creek, including all tributaries and wetlands, from the source to the most downstream White River National Forest boundary. The waters proposed are located exclusively on U.S. Forest Service lands and none are on private lands. These waters are all currently designated by the state of Colorado as critical trout habitat.
