 Introduction. This application seeks confirmation of water rights for two in-channel diversion structures which divert, capture and control the flow of the Yampa River to create features that provide for a reasonable recreation experience in and on the water for all boating and related recreational uses. Name of Structures: City of Steamboat Springs Boating Park consisting of two inchannel diversion structures (collectively the "Boating Park").

- 4. <u>Legal Description of Structures</u>: The Boating Park is located within the channel of the Yampa River in the SW1/4 SW1/4 of Section 8, T. 6 N., R. 84 W. of the 6th P.M., Routt County, Colorado. The location of the 2 recreational in-channel diversion structures comprising the Boating Park are as follows:
- (a) Structure J (aka Charlie's Hole): Located in the SW1/4 SW1/4 of Section 8, T. 6 N., R. 84 W., 6th P.M., the northeast end point of which is 649.5 feet from the south line and 669.4 feet from the west line of the SW1/4 of Section 8; and the southwest end point of which is 594.8 feet from the south line and 571.3 feet from the west line of the SW1/4 of Section 8.
- (b) Structure 2 (aka "D" Hole): Located in the SW1/4 SW1/4 of Section 8, T. 6 N., R. 84 W., 6th P.M., the northeast end point of which is 1066.2 feet from the south line and 217.7 feet from the west line of the SW1/4 of Section 8; and the southwest end point of which is 974.6 feet from the south line and 135.2 feet from the west line of the SW1/4 of Section 8.

The Boating Park extends approximately 630 feet within the channel of the Yampa River.

A map depicting the location of the structures comprising the Boating Park and the distance between these structures is attached as Exhibit A.

- Source. The Yampa River.
- Appropriation Date. December 16, 2003, or such other date as the Court may find. The
 appropriation was initiated by the construction of the Boating Park structures and the formation
 of the requisite intent to appropriate through the passage of a resolution by the Steamboat Springs
 City Council.
- Amounts Claimed. Applicant claims water rights in cubic feet per second for the time periods given for each structure comprising the Boating Park.

Flows (cfs)	500	800	1200	1700	800	300	120

The above amounts claimed are limited to the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., except during nighttime competitive events when the hours shall extend until midnight.

The above amounts are claimed as conditional; provided, however, inasmuch as the Boating Park has been constructed, Applicant reserves the right to seek these amounts as absolute to the extent that these flows are placed to a beneficial use subsequent to the aforementioned Steamboat Springs City Council resolution and prior to the date of entry of a decree in this case.

- Beneficial Uses. All recreational uses in and on the Yampa River in connection with the Boating Park, including without limitation boating, kayaking, tubing, rafting, floating, canoeing and other such general recreational uses.

 10. Remarks: (a) Precedent for the requested water rights is specifically set forth in City of Thornton v. City of Fort Collins, 830 P.2d 915 (Colo. 1992), State Eng'r v. City of Golden, 69 P.2d 1027 (2003) (aff'd by operation of law), State Eng'r v. Town of Breckenridge, 69 P.3d 1028 (2003) (aff'd by operation of law), State Eng'r v. Eagle River Water & San. Dist., 69 P.3d 1028

(2003) (aff'd by operation of law), state Eng 1 v. Eagle Hiver in the County Daily, 65 184 (2003) (aff'd by operation of law), and further supported by C.R.S. §§ 37-92-103(4), 37-92-103(7), 37-92-103(10.3) and 37-92-305(9)(b).

(b) The foregoing appropriation does not impair the ability of Colorado to fully develop and place to consumptive beneficial use its compact entitlements because, among other matters, the requested amounts are nonconsumptive; work in tandem with downstream senior water rights; and are less than the amount of water Colorado is obligated to deliver to

downstream states under the Colorado River Compact.
