# TOWN OF FIRESTONE TOILET AND WASHING MACHINE REBATE PROGRAMS

### Background

Clear Water Solutions, Inc. is assisting the Town of Firestone (Town) with implementation of the Rebate Water Efficiency Grant the Town received from the Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB). The Town began this program in August 2010 and completed a 50% progress report on March 2, 2011, and a 75% progress report in August 2011. This report summarizes the water savings and benefits of the Town's washing machine and toilet rebate programs through September 2014.

The Town staff provided Clear Water Solutions (CWS) with the usage data for the participants of the rebate programs, where available, from January 2009 through September 2014. The Town also indicated when they issued the rebate to each participant. As of December 2013, the Town had issued approximately 245 washing machine rebates and 42 toilet rebates. In 2014, through September, the Town issued five washing machine rebates and one toilet rebate. Overall, the Town has had a slow and steady response for these rebates. A description of each of the rebate programs is included below.

#### **Toilet Rebates**

This program offers a \$75.00 rebate for the installation of qualifying high-efficiency toilets purchased after April 1, 2010. It is partially funded by a grant from the CWCB. Qualifying toilets are low flush (1.28 gallons/flush or less) and dual flush toilets. The rebate application must be submitted in the same year the toilet was purchased and the toilet must be for use at an address that receives water service from the Town of Firestone and has a Town of Firestone water account number. Rebates can be filed by property owners and renters. The property owners or renters are responsible for installation and the Town reserves the right to inspect the installation of any appliance for which a rebate is provided. Other limits of the rebate program include only one toilet rebate filing per household within a five year period. The requirements for completion of the application are listed on the Town's website and the Toilet Rebate Application (see Appendix A).

#### **Water Efficient Washing Machine Rebates**

This program offers a \$125.00 rebate for the installation of qualifying high-efficiency clothes washers purchased after April 1, 2010. It is partially funded by a grant from the CWCB. Qualifying washers are listed on the Town's website.

The other requirements of the washer rebate program are similar to those listed above for the toilet rebate program. The washing machine rebate program was discontinued on October 28, 2014.

#### **Promotional Activities**

The Town promoted the rebate programs through several media publications:

- Placing rebate offer flyers in water billing statements at least twice per year (see Appendix B).
- On the Town website (<a href="http://www.ci.firestone.co.us/index.aspx?NID=200">http://www.ci.firestone.co.us/index.aspx?NID=200</a>).
- Running an article in the Town's newsletter, "FIRESTONE Voice" which is currently published four times per year (Appendix B, pg. 4 of the March-April 2013 edition).
- Advertised through Home Depot sales team.

### **Data Analysis & Winter Use Tracking**

For the analysis, we considered the usage of the participants for the core winter months of November through February as all indoor use. This method of calculating the average monthly indoor usage is cited in the CWCB MWEP Guidance Document. The 2014 data did not include any usage for the core winter months and therefore, was not analyzed in our study. Some of the participants applied for both the toilet and washing machine rebate program. Data from these participants was eliminated from our analysis because it was too difficult to determine which rebate program to associate the savings to. Data from participants was also eliminated if there was insufficient usage before or after the rebate was issued. This was often the case for the following reasons:

- The rebate was issued in early 2009.
- The rebate was issued in late 2013.
- The rebate was issued for new construction.
- The residence changed ownership during the study period and was vacant for part of the time.

### **Toilet Rebate Program Analysis**

The toilet rebate program has shown a higher water savings per participant than the washing machine program. However we estimate the total savings from the toilet rebate program from 2010 through 2013 is approximately three acre-feet, which is less than the overall savings evident from the washing machine program. CWS looked at the data for all participants in this program, and after filtering the data, we ended up with twelve participants that were analyzed. This rebate program showed an average savings of approximately 18.7%. The indoor average usage of each participant before

the rebate was issued was 4,151 gallons per month (based on the core winter months) and after the rebate was issued it was 3,452 gallons per month. This equates to a savings of approximately 699 gallons per month, or 0.026 acre-feet per year per participant. The Town is planning on continuing the toilet rebate program. This data is also displayed in Table 1 below and in Appendix C.

### **Washing Machine Rebate Program Analysis**

The washing machine rebate program had more participants and a higher overall water savings of ten acre-feet, as compared to the toilet rebate program. However, the saving per participant was significantly lower than the savings per participant of the toilet rebate. We spoke to the Town staff about this and they felt many washing machine rebates went to new construction and were not being used to replace less efficient washing machines. They also indicated that since the water efficient washing machines are not a permanent fixture in the home, when residents moved they often take the washing machines with them. There were a total of 250 participants for this program and CWS looked at the data for 100 participants in this program. After filtering the data, we ended up with 96 participants that were analyzed. This rebate program showed an average savings of approximately 8.6%. The average indoor usage of each participant before the rebate was issued was 4,825 gallons per month and after the rebate was issued it was 4,436 gallons per month. This equates to a savings of approximately 389 gallons per month, or 0.014 acre-feet per year per participant (please see Appendix C).

The lackluster savings per individual evident for the washing machine program versus the toilet program, could simply lie in the size of the data pools analyzed. There was significantly more data available for the washing machine program. However, after the rebates were issued, the toilet program showed higher water savings per participant.

### **Rebate Program Surveys**

The Town completed surveys for the rebate programs in compliance with Task No. 4 of the Town of Firestone's CWCB Water Efficiency Grant Request submitted July 13, 2010 to CWCB. The results of this survey can be found in Appendix D. The survey was based on six questions and included several general comments from participants. Approximately, 87.2% of the survey responses were from participants of the washing machine rebate program and 12.8% were from participants of the toilet rebate program. Most of the participants were satisfied with the rebate program and the Town's responsiveness to processing their applications. More of the participants were satisfied with the operation and water savings achieved with the high efficiency toilets, versus the high-efficiency washing machines.

#### **How to Apply and Program Rules:**

- 1. Purchase and install a qualifying High-Efficiency 1.28 gpf Toilet. For a list of qualifying toilets please visit <a href="http://www.epa.gov/watersense/product\_search.html">http://www.epa.gov/watersense/product\_search.html</a>. The models listed were chosen for their efficient use of water.
  - The product must be purchased after April 1, 2010. Rebate application must be submitted in the same year the toilet was purchased. Example if you purchased your washer on July 15, 2010, you must submit your rebate application by December 31, 2010.
  - Purchased toilet must be for use at an address that receives water service from the Town of Firestone. Residents of other cities and/or customers of other water providers are not eligible. A Town of Firestone water account number is required.
  - Rebates can be filed by property owners and renters. Contractors or anyone else working with a property that they do not own cannot apply for a rebate. The property owners or renters are responsible for installation.
  - The Town reserves the right to inspect the installation of any appliance for which a rebate is provided.
  - One of each type of rebate per household and one of each type of rebate per household within a five year period.
- 2. The original copy of sales receipt must be attached to the application and include the date of purchase, price, manufacture name, model name and model number. Please keep a copy of the receipt for your records or apply in person to keep your original.
- 3. A photograph of the installed toilet is required.
- 4. All blank fields below need to be completed for application to be processed.
- 5. Provide proof of US citizenship or legal status in the United Sates by providing a photocopy of one of listed forms of identification on the Affidavit of Lawful Presence form. Complete the Affidavit of Lawful Presence section of the application and attach a photocopy of identification.
- 6. Rebate program availability will be on a first come first serve basis.
- 7. When application and all required documentation is received, applicants will be required to complete a short survey on the rebate program in order to complete the application process. Applicants can either complete the survey online at <a href="http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/RVTHWHY">http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/RVTHWHY</a> or by picking up a survey at Town Hall.
- 8. Once all the above steps are completed, the Town of Firestone will issue applicants rebate. Please allow up to 6 to 8 weeks to receive rebate.

Dear Town of Firestone water customers,

We would like to inform you of a step in the application process with which you must comply before receiving your rebate.

On July 31, 2006, Governor Bill Owens signed into law House Bill 06S-1023, which restricts who may receive public benefits in the State of Colorado. Under the new law, any individual person older than 18 years of age must prove lawful presence in the United States in order to receive non-emergency public benefits, such as the rebate for which you have applied. The new law went into effect August 1, 2006.

In order to prove lawful presence in the United States, you must produce one of the following forms of identification:

- a valid driver's license from one of the following states that the Colorado Department of Revenue has deemed eligible: Colorado, Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Virginia, West Virginia, or Wyoming;
- a valid Colorado identification card;
- a United States military card;
- a United States military dependent's identification card;
- a United States Coast Guard Merchant Mariner card:
- a Native American tribal document:
- a Naturalization or citizenship certificate;
- a Court-issued adoption order;
- an I-94 immigration form with refugee or asylum status;
- an unexpired resident alien card, permanent resident card, temporary resident card or employment authorization card.

You may mail a photocopy of your identification (in one of the forms listed above) to the Town of Firestone at the address below. We assure you that this information will remain highly confidential. You may remove/darken all sensitive information such as driver's license number or social security numbers from the copy of your identification that you submit to the Town of Firestone.

In addition, completion of the affidavit attached is also required.



# Community outreach meetings planned for March to solicit ideas

Residents who participate in their local government not only get the opportunity to bring their ideas to the table, but the participation also fosters great working relationships between them and their local leaders. The Town has organized two community outreach meetings in March to start discussions regarding the streets and parks sustainability initiative and Firestone's needs for the future. Each of the meetings will discuss and highlight the same topics, so residents are encouraged to attend the one that best fits their schedule. The meetings are set for March 16 from 11 a.m. to 12 p.m., and on March 19 from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. Both meetings will be at Firestone Town Hall, 151 Grant Ave.

### **Board of Trustee Meetings & Work Sessions**

The Town also recently completed a community survey that asked for feedback regarding the most recent ballot initiative that failed in the November 2012 election. Ballot question 2A was a tax initiative proposing a 1 percent sales tax increase for 15 years to address capital improvement and maintenance projects, fund street improvements and provide critical infrastructure. The temporary component of the tax would have allowed voters to re-address the issue when the time limit was met.

Currently, there are no sales tax revenues dedicated to streets operations and maintenance. As a result,

many of the streets have begun to deteriorate sooner than they should.

The survey results have been tallied and the Board of Trustees is thankful for the great response. The results will allow them to weigh in on the details of what the public views as important when it comes to Firestone's future.

Since the November election, the Board of Trustees has spent numerous work sessions reviewing options for a sustainability plan for streets and parks. While they are reviewing several scenarios, the community outreach meetings will allow them to visit with residents and garner further ideas on the best steps forward.

The U.S. Census Bureau found that Weld County was among the fastest growing counties in the nation throughout the last 10 years. 

# Public works begins installation of new water meter reading system

Due to customer service, aging water meters and water conservation methods, the Town of Firestone has implemented a replacement program of its meter reading system to be completed by 2015.

The first phase of the project started in late 2012 when Public Works employees started replacing units located in property front yards. The first phase of the program replaced 1,153 outdated meters not compatible with a fixed base system. Phase two involved the installation of radio towers and pit radios which transmit hourly readings to the utility billing department 24 hours a day, seven days per week.

The new system will allow the utility billing department to alert customers of leaks in household plumbing, leaks in unoccupied dwellings and, when fully operational, customers will be able to access their account at any time of day to view usage, leaks and estimated monthly service charges.



"This upgraded program shows how Firestone continues to serve customers with the most competitive water rates on the Front Range, while using the latest technology," said Theo Abkes, Public Works Director.

# Town Board deliberates on proposed Kurtz Ranch annexation

The proposed Second Amendment Firearms Experience (S.A.F.E.) in Firestone has been put on hold at the request of the applicant. At the Feb. 13 Firestone Board of Trustees meeting, Ron Abramson, the applicant and managing partner for S.A.F.E, read into the record his intent to temporarily withdraw his application for a proposed law enforcement and public shooting and training facility so they can review and address concerns brought forth during the public hearing process.

The Town of Firestone received an initial application on Dec. 5, 2012, for annexation, outline development plan and final development plan. The applications requested annexation of the property and other land use approvals that would have permitted a firearms training facility and shooting range to be utilized by law enforcement personnel and civilian members. The property is located approximately 1 mile north of Firestone's northern boundary, generally located north of Colo. Highway 66 and east of Weld County Road 17. The Firestone Trail easement already bisects the property and the proposed annexation would provide hundreds of acres of open space and recreation.

LaVanchy said the Town processed the application request pursuant to the Firestone development regulations, starting with a neighborhood meeting and public hearings before the Firestone Planning and Zoning Commission and the Town Board of Trustees.

"The planning and zoning process was very transparent and allowed for people to participate and express their points of view on the various applications," he said. The Planning and Zoning Commission heard testimony for nine hours spread throughout two evenings. On Feb. 12 the Commission voted to recommend approval of all the applications to the Town Board of Trustees on a five to one vote.

Following the applicant's submittal to withdraw his application at the Board of Trustees meeting, Don Jones, the representative of the land owner expressed his continued desire to annex the property into Firestone and asked for a 60 day ex-

tension to complete that process. The annexation and zoning applications are scheduled to come back before the Board on April 24.

"The Town fully expects to move forward with the annexation and approve a revised master plan, as well as review the resubmitted application from the applicant when that occurs," LaVanchy said. The updated master plan is planned to expand potential land uses of the proposed annexed property. The property lies adjacent to the northern boundaries of the Firestone Trail system.

Town Mayor Chad Auer said, "I am extremely proud of how our Town staff, Planning Commission members and citizens have engaged in this process. Land use issues often evoke strong emotions and, at times, garner heightened attention from media, enterprising attorneys and various activists alike.

"At the end of the day, our obligation is to facilitate a fair, transparent and legal process that is focused on the facts of the applications and to make a common sense, fact driven decisions. Looking forward, we will continue to work with this and every other land owner who wishes to become a part of the great community of Firestone," he ended.

# Tornado sirens to be deactivated in March

# Residents urged to sign up for phone, mobile alerts

The Town Board of Trustees for both Firestone and Frederick have chosen to deactivate the current civil defense sirens in March used in the communities to warn people of severe weather. The sirens only have a typical audible effectiveness range radius of one-half to 1 mile. That leaves approximately 24 square miles of the communities outside of the effective range of siren coverage.

The Town of Firestone and Frederick-Firestone Fire Protection District are alerting residents to move to more effective warning systems for severe weather. The systems include:

Emergency response and emergency management agencies within Weld County and the Carbon Valley area are recommending that all residents register their mobile phone, home phone, pager, email and other electronic devices for emergency notifications through any of the following websites.







# Q4 Why did you decided to install a new High-Efficiency Toilet or Washing Machine?




