### 3. Statement of reasons for obtaining party status

TerraCarta is an energy development company that owns water rights on Yellow Creek that may be affected by the ISF Appropriations. TerraCarta is obtaining party status in order to protect its interests in the Yellow Creek basin and surrounding area. More specifically, TerraCarta is joining this proceeding to insure that the ISF Appropriations are permitted by law and that they will not damage or impair TerraCarta's water rights or its energy development activities in the area.
