FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, RULING OF REFEREE, JUDGMENT AND DECREE OF THE WATER COURT	

This matter comes before the Water Referee by Application of the Colorado Water Conservation Board ("CWCB") for a water right to preserve the natural environment to a reasonable degree. The Application was filed on December 18, 2014. The Water Court for Water Division 4 referred the Application to the Water Referee for Water Division 4, by in accordance with section 37-92-101, C.R.S (2014).

The Referee, having made such investigations as are necessary to determine whether or not the statements in the Application are true, having consulted with the Division Engineer for Water Division 4, and being fully advised in the premises, does hereby make the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Ruling of the Referee in this matter:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The statements in the Application are true.
2. The name and address of Applicant:

3. Notice and Jurisdiction: All notices of this matter required by law have been fulfilled and the Court has jurisdiction over the Application and all parties affected thereby, whether or not they have chosen to appear.

4. Opposers: No Statements of Opposition were filed and the time for filing additional Statements of Opposition has expired.

5. Summary of Consultation: The Division Engineer filed a Summary of Consultation pursuant to section 37-92-302(4), C.R.S. (2014), dated March 31, 2015. The CWCB filed a response to the Summary of Consultation on April 30, 2015. The Referee has given the Summary and Response due consideration.

6. Name of water right: Increased Hot Springs Creek Instream Flow Water Right. The CWCB has an existing instream flow water right on Hot Springs Creek from the headwaters to the confluence with Tomichi Creek, in the amount of 1.5 cfs (January 1 to December 31), decreed in Case No. 84CW374, Water Div. 4, appropriated on May 4, 1984. The increased Hot Springs Creek Instream Flow Water Right sought herein are in addition to the amount of the existing instream flow water right for the portion of the existing stream segment identified below, in order to preserve the natural environment to a reasonable degree.

7. Legal Description: The Increased Hot Springs Creek Instream Flow Water Right is located in the natural stream channel of Hot Springs Creek from the outlet of Hot Springs Reservoir extending to the L.L. Bush Ditch No. 4 headgate, a distance of approximately 3.46 miles. This segment can be located on the Doyleville and Pitkin U.S.G.S. quadrangles. A map of the Hot Springs Creek Instream Flow Water Right is attached as **Exhibit 1**.

A. Upstream Terminus: Hot Springs Creek outlet of Hot Springs Reservoir at:

1. UTM: Northing: 4263872.08 Easting: 365614.28 (NAD 1983 Zone 13 North).
2. PLSS: NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 16, Township 49 North, Range 4 East NM PM, 1,138' East of the West Section Line; 169' South of the North Section Line.
3. Lat/Long: latitude 38° 30' 47.14"N and longitude 106° 32' 29.02"W.

B. Downstream Terminus: L.L. Bush Ditch No. 4 Headgate in the vicinity of:

1. UTM: Northing: 4261332.33 Easting: 361699.68 (NAD 1983 Zone 13 North).
 2. PLSS: SE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 24, Township 49 North, Range 3 East NM PM, 943' West of the East Section Line; 830' North of the South Section Line.
 3. Lat/Long: latitude 38° 29' 22.61"N and longitude 106° 35' 8.8"W.
- C. The Universal Transverse Mercator (UTM) and geographical descriptions (e.g., confluences) of the upstream and downstream termini will be used as the legal descriptions for the water rights in this application. The Public Land Survey System (PLSS) and Lat/Long coordinates are provided as cross-reference locations only. The UTM, PLSS and Lat/Long locations for the upstream and downstream termini were derived from CWCB GIS using the National Hydrography Dataset (NHD). The PLSS locations in this decree were derived from CWCB GIS using 2005 PLSS data from the U.S. Bureau of Land Management's Geographic Coordinate Database.
8. Source: Hot Springs Creek, tributary to Tomichi Creek.
 9. A. Date of initiation of appropriation: January 28, 2014.

B. How appropriation was initiated: Appropriation and beneficial use occurred on January 28, 2014 by the action of the CWCB under the provisions of sections 37-92-102(3) and (4) and 37-92-103(3), (4) and (10), C.R.S. (2014).

C. Date applied to beneficial use: January 28, 2014.
 10. Amount of water claimed: Increased instream flow of 2.4 cfs (May 1 to July 21), absolute. Along with the existing 1.5 cfs instream flow water right decreed to the CWCB in Case No. 84CW374, the combined total would equal instream flow water rights of 3.9 cfs for the segment identified herein.
 11. Use of the Water: Instream flow to preserve the natural environment to a reasonable degree.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Ruling of Referee
Judgment and Decree of the Water Court
Case No. 2014CW3094
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12. The foregoing Findings of Fact are incorporated herein to the extent they constitute conclusions of law.

13. Notice and Jurisdiction: The Water Court for Division 4 has jurisdiction over the subject matter of these proceedings and over all persons, owners of property and water rights that may be affected hereby, whether or not they have chosen to appear. The Application in this matter and the resume publication of the Application placed such persons on notice of the relief requested by the Application and granted by this decree. §§ 37-92-203 and 302, C.R.S. (2014).

14. The CWCB has fulfilled all legal requirements for a decree for water rights including sections 37-92-302, 304 and 305, C.R.S. (2014).

15. Burden of Proof: The CWCB has complied with all requirements and has met its burden of proof to adjudicate the water rights required in the Application and is therefore entitled to a decree approving the requested water rights.

RULING OF REFEREE

16. The foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law are hereby approved and incorporated as the Ruling of Referee by this reference.

17. The application is granted and a decree to increase the instream flow in the amount of 2.4 cfs (May 1 to July 21), absolute, is hereby entered to preserve the natural environment to a reasonable degree in the reach of Hot Springs Creek between the upstream and downstream termini described in paragraph 7 above. The appropriation date for this water right is January 28, 2014.

18. The priority herein confirmed was filed in the water court in the year of 2014 and shall be junior to all priorities filed in previous years. As between all rights filed in the same calendar year, priorities shall be determined by historical date of appropriation and not affected by the date of entry of ruling.


19. The CWCB shall install and maintain such measuring devices and keep such records as the Division Engineer may require for administration of this right.

It is accordingly **ORDERED** that this Ruling shall be filed with the water clerk subject to judicial review.

It is further **ORDERED** that a copy of this Ruling shall be filed with the Division Engineer and the State Engineer.


