Summary of Significant Activity for the Period October 23 to December 3, 2011

Land Plan Implementation

- Routine and on-going discussion with neighboring land-owners in conformance with Good Neighbor Policy for all properties, and with property owners and real estate agents that will lead to identification of new potential properties. The focus is on properties with non-complex, palustrine wetland and wet meadow potential. Several opportunities are emerging for sand pit and palustrine wetland properties.
- Negotiations proceeding on acquisition of two properties in the Elm Creek Complex, significant issues have arisen in association with the NAWCA Grant and associated encumbrances. Efforts underway to salvage the deal, but closing will not occur prior to year end.
- Efforts underway to develop strategy for disposal of excess property at Newark Pit and Leaman East locations. Coordination with a LAC subcommittee on-going.
- On-going coordination with NGPC resulting from agreement regarding services for development and implementation of public access management system. Activities focused resolution of website development issues. Full scale launch expected December 12th.
- Two fall burns completed on Cottonwood Ranch and Binfield Properties.
- Updates to Complex Management Plans underway for 2012 activities together with initiation of development of plans for new Land Management Plans for recently acquired properties. Close coordination with LAC to incorporate feedback and ideas of stakeholders. Plans and corresponding budget items under development simultaneously.
- Development of work plan and budget for 2012 Land Plan finalized, pending GC approval.
- Routine management, oversight, and maintenance operations on all properties and equipment, including fence repair, well maintenance, road maintenance, and building upkeep.
- Routine seasonal land management activities involving contractor selection, coordination, and oversight on several properties including under story clearing, tree removal, noxious weed control, grass seeding, and similar actions.
- Routine coordination with tenants on agricultural operations.
- Attendance and participation in LAC meetings in Kearney, NE on October 26th and November 28th.

Water Plan Implementation

 Phase II J2 Reregulating Reservoir feasibility investigations to refine alternatives and conclude full feasibility on-going. Additional investigation of use of reservoir to enhance irrigation season power production completed. Extensive coordination effort required and considerable EDO (and CNPPID) staff time being spent to keep consultant on track in feasibility evaluation process and development of usable product. Close coordination with WAC work group on-going.

- Work continuing on development of J2 Reregulating Reservoir Sponsorship Agreement. Conference calls held with committee on November 7th and 23rd.
- Continued coordination efforts with NRDs, DNR, and CNPPID associated with ground water recharge pilot demonstration project. Extensive coordination effort required and considerable EDO staff time being spent to coordinate consultant and WAC work group in feasibility evaluation process and development of usable product. Construction of recharge pit and water delivery system complete and operations have commenced. System functioning as planned, ground water levels and drain flows being closely monitored to prevent damage to neighbors.
- On-going discussions with surface water right holders interested in selling water yields to Program. Discussions between NPPD, DNR, and CPNRD with the Program concerning such water transfers occurring simultaneously with discussions with water rights holders. Legal counsel assisting with agreement development.
- Conducting additional analyses using 1D hydraulic and sediment transport model to better define problem in the context of development of alternative solutions in the North Platte Choke Point area. Contact and discussions with Lincoln County and City of North Platte officials have lead EDO to understand that flooding has created a more cooperative attitude among property owners toward channel clearing and improvement activities. Follow up under way.
- Hydrologic conditions update made and posted on website.
- Attendance and presentation by Chad Smith at Nebraska Water Resources Association/Nebraska State Irrigation Association Meeting in Kearney, Nebraska November 21st and 22nd..
- Development of work plan and budget for 2012 Water Plan finalized, pending GC approval.
- Attendance and participation in WAC meeting in Casper, WY on October 24th and 25th, including tour of Pathfinder Reservoir Spillway Modification Project.
- Attendance and participation in EAC/RCC meeting in Kearney, NE on November 8th.

Adaptive Management Plan Implementation

- Considerable staff time expended in pursuit of permit application to USACE for sediment augmentation efforts. Meeting held in Omaha, NE with Corps, TriBasin NRD, and Program staff and consultants.
- Coordination with contractors and consultants for geomorphology and in-channel vegetation monitoring and water quality monitoring for 2011 season. RFP's under development for both activities.
- Oversight of whooping crane habitat use database development.
- Oversight of website and database management system development and maintenance activities.
- Oversight and coordination of 1D Model development from North Platte to McConaughy. Steady-state calibration effort completed, and unsteady model calibration effort nearing completion.
- On-going effort toward production of AMP documents including: Synthesis Report, Implementation Report, Data Analysis Plan, and Habitat Selection Experimental Design. Heavy emphasis on completing the Data Analysis Plan and advancing Synthesis Report.
- Review of ISAC Report evaluating Program AMP efforts and development of responses.
- Elm Creek proof of concept and Sediment Augmentation monitoring and design efforts on-going requiring considerable staff effort and consultant, special advisor coordination.
- On-going effort in advancing experimental design criteria and development of specific site design layouts plans focusing on Cottonwood Ranch, Elm Creek, Plum Creek, and Ft. Kearny Complexes.
- Wet meadow design for Fox Tract under way.
- Attendance and participation in joint TAC/ISAC meeting in Denver, CO on November 29th and 30th.
- Development of work plan and budget for 2012 AMP finalized, pending GC approval.

Outreach and Operations

- Routine daily operations associated with management and support of EDO staff, acquisition of supplies and equipment, oversight of consultant and contractor contracts and payment, maintenance of property files, coordination of meeting logistics, and general administration of Program.
- Budget and Work Plan development for 2012 finalized, including equipment purchase agreement and Headwaters 2012 contract, pending GC approval.
- Participation in Finance Committee conference call on November 9th.
- Participation in Governance Committee Special Session conference call focused on budget issues on November 18th.
