Summary of Water Court Application

The Applicant is changing storage water rights and claimed irrigation control structure water rights to different places of storage on applicant's land. New structures with changed water rights are to be augmented with two previously decreed augmentation plans.

Staff Recommendation

Staff requests ratification of the Statement of Opposition filed to protect CWCB's instream flow water rights.

Potential for Injury

- The proposed change of water rights could cause an expansion of use and could alter the time, place and amount of historical return flows, which could injure the CWCB's instream flow water rights.
- The proposed plan for augmentation may not replace depletions in the proper time, place and amount, which could injure the CWCB's instream flow water rights.
- It is unclear whether the storage structures will be operated as flow through structures and if so, with which water right. Flow through structures can injure the CWCB's instream flow water right because the diversion is fully depletive to a segment of the intervening instream flow.
