38 Land Tract 0918

- 39 Sackett provided an update on Tract 0918 and discussed the documents provided to the GC for this
- 40 meeting. The Program has negotiated a purchase value of \$2.75 million for 1,445 acres. The LAC met
- 41 today and developed the following motion:
- 42
- 43 "In recognition of the GC's consideration of Tract 0918 this afternoon, and in recognition of the
- 44 exceptional habitat value of Tract 0918, the LAC recommends that the GC approve the purchase of Tract
- 45 0918 and that it count towards Program objectives. The motion passed unanimously. John Heaston and
- 46 Ted LaGrange abstained due to their organizations' past and ongoing interest in the parcel."

48 Sackett said there was discussion in the LAC about the strength or weakness of the current easements on 49 the property. It was determined that there are enough flaws in the easement to have concern about its

50 ability to ensure protection in perpetuity. Thabault asked if some proportion of the existing easement will

- 51 remain on the land the current property owner will continue to hold. Sackett said yes it is approximately a
- 52 third of the property the current owner will retain. Thabault asked Heaston what, if any, capability the
- environmental coalition has to bring any money to bear to partner on acquisition of this property.
- 54 Heaston said there is currently no fiscal capital available. The Whooping Crane Trust has two tracts of
- agricultural land they could sell to contribute and there is an outstanding Environmental Trust Grant that
- 56 will not be decided until next year. The current owner now wants to sell the property before the end of
- 57 the year. Thabault asked if the environmental coalition will still pursue funds to kick in at a later date.
- Heaston said that is a possibility but the coalition cannot meet the demands of the seller before the end ofthe year.

61 Sackett said this was discussed during the LAC. The LAC decided the Program should buy the property

- 62 in its entirety then the LAC and GC could decide to do something else with the property at a later time if
- 63 necessary. Strauch asked if it is a perpetual easement. Sackett said yes. Strauch asked if any of the terms
- are contrary to the Program. Sackett said no. Barels asked if the easement could go away if the Program
   buys it. Sackett said that could be discussed with the Trust based on the current value of the easement.

  Barels asked if the current owner was retaining any buildings. Sackett said ves there is a home site with
- 67 additional buildings. Barels asked if this was considered in the negotiations. Sackett said yes and this
- 68 was taken out and left with the sellers.

70 Purcell moved to approve acquisition; Ament seconded. Schneider said we need to make it clear that this

- 71 property will count toward Program objectives in the First Increment. <u>Thabault said the U.S. Fish and</u>
- 72 Wildlife Service decided the full acreage (1,445 acres) will count toward Program land objectives in the
- <u>First Increment</u>. Heaston abstained. Motion approved.
