Background:

For this agenda item the Board is provided with a brief overview of applications to the Water Supply Reserve Account (WSRA). Attachments to this memo include:

- Summary spreadsheet detailing funding requests for the basin and statewide accounts;
- Summary spreadsheet displaying current WSRA Balance Summary of Fund Appropriations and Receipts by Fiscal Year, and Fund Distribution by Basin and Statewide Account.
- Water Activity Summary Sheets which provide an overview, discussion, issues/additional needs, and staff recommendation regarding funding, partial funding, or not funding the applications.

Staff's review of the applications involves the following steps:

- 1) Applications are reviewed for completeness based on the information requirements, which are primarily outlined in Part 2 of the Criteria and Guidelines (C&G).
- 2) Applications are reviewed to verify that the water activity meets the eligibility requirements in Section 39-29-108 (III) C.R.S. (C&G, Part 2) and the threshold criteria, which are based on the requirements of Section 39-29-108 (III) C.R.S., and two



- sections of the Water for the 21st Century Act (House Bill 1177); Section 37-75-102 and Section 37-75-104(2)(c) (C&G, Part 3). Staff also verifies that the applicant was an eligible entity to receive funding (C&G, Part 2).
- 3) Staff then prepares the Water Activity Summary Sheet which documents the outcome of the review process and contains staff's recommendations.

Water Supply Reserve Account Balance Summary and Project Status Report:

To provide the Board updates on the status of specific Water Supply Reserve Account grant applications and projects, staff provides a status report in the CWCB Director's Report. The WSRA status report includes the following information:

- List of completed WSRA projects;

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$150,000 from the Arkansas Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Implementing the Education and Outreach Goals of the Ark BIP through Education to Action Projects/Programs over a 3-year Period.

Water Activity Summary: WSRA funds, if approved, will be expended to fund the program: Implementing the Education and Outreach Goals of the Ark BIP through Education to Action Projects/Programs over a 3-year Period. These funds are requested by the Arkansas River Basin Water Forum in partnership with the PEPO Committee and the Executive Committee of the Arkansas Basin roundtable. The goal of this collaboration is to provide leadership in water education and promote education action projects/programs that address the needs of the Arkansas Basin Implementation Plan. Four goals were identified in the Ark BIP as areas of concern: storage, agriculture, municipal, and environment/recreation. Funding will be used to address these concerns, provide education and promote action through multiple outreach mechanisms geared to engage a vas audience.

The proposed projects/programs will include an hour-long documentary plus webisodes that will focus on the economic and social values of the Arkansas River, a Water Festivals Toolkit to support and implement water festivals in Pueblo, Trinidad, Colorado Springs, and Salida, along with "mini" festivals in small communities across the basin; Water Education Activity Books developed locally and distributed through summer reading programs in Ark Basin public libraries; Education to Action Program that will provide an outreach mechanism to promote collaboration and implementation of Ark BIP identified planned projects; and a Project Coordinator to organize and manage tasks for all proposed programs.

Discussion: The proposed program and deliverables are designed to line up with the next steps identified in the Arkansas Basin Implementation Plan, and are consistent with the education and outreach goals in Colorado's Water Plan. The program is designed to unify the efforts of the Roundtable, PEPO, and the ARBWF, which represent the most active education and outreach programs in the basin.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$54,300 from the Colorado Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Eagle County Conservation District Irrigation Asset Inventory Program.

Water Activity Summary: WSRA funds, if approved, will be expended to fund the Eagle County Conservation District (ECCD) Irrigation Asset Inventory Program. The project proposes to develop a program to assess the condition of the agricultural infrastructure within the ECCD's boundaries, ultimately assigning a "conditional ranking" to irrigation system infrastructure to assist with the prioritization of improvements and funding needs.

The inventory and assessment process will evaluate all ditch related structures from the diversion structure to the last lateral. The inventory will photo document the existing condition of the structures along with a brief editorial summary and condition assessment. Ditch system structures to be evaluated include: diversion structure, headgate and wingwalls, return headgate and ditch, measuring structure, ditch condition throughout length of ditch, culverts, and lateral headgates as available. Environmental (non-consumptive) attributes will also be documented near the diversion structure and as identified by the ditch owner. Environmental attributes to be identified include riparian areas and condition, fish habitat and barriers, erosive prone areas, and dechannelized flows.

The major goals of the program are as follows:

- Education The program will provide system owners with a ditch summary report that will document ditch operations, top concerns and needs as well as provide a resource of contact and maintenance tips. This report may also be used by the ditch owners as supplemental support of top needs when seeking additional funding or project support.
- Collaboration Connecting ditch owners to regional partners that can assist in the funding and implementation of identified top concerns. The potential for future agricultural structural

- projects that can offer environmental improvements will also be assessed as part of the ditch evaluation.
- Environmental conditions evaluated include potential for improved fish habitat and barriers, riparian area, channelized streams, sediment reductions, and reducing the potential for water quality degradation.
- Collaboration Prioritized list of (non-ditch specific) agricultural projects with multiple benefits that potential partnering organizations could review when looking for teaming opportunities.
- Build Trust Build confidence among peers in agriculture community through maintaining a high level of privacy related to specific ditch conditions and only proceeding on ditch evaluations and partnership opportunities with owner's permissions.

Discussion: The Irrigation Asset Inventory Program was included in the Colorado River Basin Implementation Plan as a top regional project to support agriculture in the Eagle River and State Bridge regions both of which are covered by the ECCD. The project also meets five of the Colorado BIP's six themes:

- Sustain Agriculture
- Protect and Restore Healthy Streams, Rivers, Lakes and Riparian Areas
- Secure Safe Drinking Water
- Assure Dependable Basin Administration
- High Basinwide Conservation

More information on these themes, and how the project addresses these themes, is located within the application.
