During the Winter, Spring and Summer of 2016, the Water Efficiency Film Project began and evolved into a dynamic and useful educational tool for homeowners and others interested in urban water conservation. An Advisory Council was created which consisted of:

HaveyPro Cinema was hired to create the film, and included Alysha Burney and Jim Havey. Some of the following information has been provided by them in reports to the project manager:

The purpose of the film was to redefine and update how we talk about water efficiency and its role is in the future of water management in Colorado. The film addresses the big picture of water usage issues, and how they relate to individual use and responsibility while highlighting the cumulative impact of efficiency efforts and motivating viewer action and behavior change.

The focus is urban water, mostly residential with a nod to some commercial aspects like hotels and/or offices.

The audience is the general public and university students. The film will premiere at the Colorado Water Congress Annual Conference in Denver in January 2017.

Distribution includes water meetings and conferences, business organizations and associations, a variety of web sites, and "the third place" where people connect through mutual experiences and interests: church, gym, neighborhood associations, etc. OWOW Center and/or Metropolitan State University of Denver students may be tasked with creating a distribution plan.
