Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$45,675 from the Yampa/White/Green Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Maybell Ditch Improvement Project.

Water Activity Summary: WSRF funds, if approved will be expended to assist the Maybell Irrigation District perform improvements to their irrigation infrastructure, including the installation of a remotely controlled automated headgate, several measuring devices, installation of three check structures, and the rebuilding and lining of 400 feet of existing earthen ditch. More specifically, WSRF Funds will be expended to assist the Ditch Company perform improvements to the existing ditch. These improvements, when completed will improve irrigation delivery efficiency and provide an improvement in water quality in the Yampa River.

Discussion: This project meets many of the goals and objectives identified in the Yampa/White/Green Basin Implementation Plan (YWG BIP). More specifically, this project helps the Basin achieve the following goals: Protect and encourage agriculture uses of water in the YWG Basin within the context of private property rights; Improve agricultural water supplies to increase irrigated land and reduce shortages; and Restore, maintain, and modernize water storage and distribution infrastructure; while also assisting Colorado *Maintain Agricultural Viability*, and *Support Agricultural Conservation and Efficiency* as called for in Chapter 10 of Colorado's Water Plan.
