<u>Revised Statement of Work</u> <u>Revision Date: July 12, 2016</u>

WATER ACTIVITY NAME – Implementing the Education and Outreach Goals of the ArkBIP through Education to Action Projects / Programs over a Three-year period

GRANT RECIPIENT – Arkansas River Basin Water Forum (ARBWF)

FUNDING SOURCE – CWCB WSRA grant program

Task 1 – Arkansas River Basin Documentary & Webisodes

REVISION is to extend the timeline and increase the budgeted amount for this task to compensate for the unavailability of additional WSRA grant funding until July 2017. It is imperative that work on this task continue in order to meet production deadlines. The budget will be increased by \$5,000. The task statement of work does not change, although the lack of additional WSRA grant funds may affect the schedule. The PEPO Workgroup is striving to keep this project funded in an adequate manner in order to continue work at a sufficient pace.

Description of Task:

ARBWF, PEPO, and the Arkansas Basin Roundtable Executive Committee will partner with CSU Pueblo to produce an hour-long documentary video that will be submitted to Rocky Mountain PBS (RMPBS) for broadcast and will be distributed throughout the Ark Basin. The program will explore the economic and social benefit of the Arkansas River from Leadville to Lamar. Several complementary webisodes will be created that will address topics and areas of concern identified in the ArkBIP.

Method/Procedure:

2016: Filming and Interviews

- High Definition filming that will include aerial footage of the Arkansas River,
- Interviews with water experts who will explain concepts such as: Inter-basin transfers, water storage, in-stream flow management, etc.
- Interviews with professionals and the public who have a background in agricultural, municipal, environmental and recreational uses.

2017: Video Production, Editing & Distribution

- Continued filming, video production, editing and distribution to RMPBS
- 2018: Webisodes & Distribution
 - Webisode production, distribution and marketing of documentary and webisodes throughout the Basin.

Deliverable:

The hour-long documentary will be delivered to Rocky Mountain PBS' programming department with the goal of receiving an airing on the statewide TV network. Webisodes will be embedded in various websites relating to the Arkansas River Basin and will be designed to provide a brief overview of water related issue and links to additional resources. The documentary and webisodes will be presented and distributed throughout the Arkansas River Basin at various educational events. Anticipate viewership of 100,000 from PBS and tens of thousands online.

TASK 2 – Community Water Festival Development and Implementation

REVISION is to not develop a Water Festival Tool Kit because these types of Tool Kits are readily available on the internet. This revision will reduce the task budget by \$6,840.

Revised Description of Task:

The ARBWF and Partners are dedicated to providing Ark Basin communities with the necessary resources and tools to educate their citizens on water related topics. This program will be designed to provide education and outreach through a community-led water festival. The ARBWF and PEPO will pull on the partnerships already developed in the Upper Arkansas Basin by hosting the ARBWF there in 2016. Potential partners are Greater Arkansas River Nature Association, Arkansas River Outfitters Association, Arkansas Headwaters Recreation Area, Colorado Parks and Wildlife, Salida Parks and Recreation, Land Trust of the Upper Arkansas, San Isabel Land Protection Trust, Upper Arkansas Water Conservancy District, Trout Unlimited, The Nature Conservancy, etc. ARBWF, PEPO, and partners will plan, coordinate and implement a new Community Water Festival in Salida, where such a program does not currently exist. The partners will encourage participation and /or attendance by 4-H, Boys/Girls Scouts, Future Farmers of America, Boys and Girls Clubs, and other youth oriented groups in the water festival.

Revised Method/Procedure:

2016: Kick off Community Water Festivals in selected community within the Basin

- The first year of this program will be spent gaining knowledge through partnerships and involvement in the already existing water festivals in Pueblo and Trinidad
- Develop partnerships with ARBWF partners in the upper basin to plan, coordinate and implement a Community Water Festival
- Provide management, festival planning, outreach with local partners, project coordination, funding, volunteer organization, and implementation of the new Community Water Festival

2017: Implementation of Water Festivals in selected community within the Basin

- The second year of this program will continue to gain knowledge through partnerships and involvement in already existing water festivals in Salida, Pueblo, and Trinidad
- Develop partnerships with ARBWF partners in the area where the ARBWF will be held in 2017 to plan, coordinate, and implement a Community Water Festival
- Provide management, festival planning, outreach with local partners, project coordination, funding, volunteer organization, and implementation of the new Community Water Festival

2018: Implementation of Water Festivals in selected community within the Basin

- The third year of this program will continue to gain knowledge through partnerships and involvement in already existing water festivals in the selected 2017 location, Salida, Pueblo, and Trinidad
- Develop partnerships with ARBWF partners in the area where the ARBWF will be held in 2018 to plan, coordinate, and implement a Community Water Festival
- Provide management, festival planning, outreach with local partners, project coordination, funding, volunteer organization, and implementation of the new Community Water Festival

Revised Deliverable:

Successful implementation of these programs will build the foundation for water education that can be used for years to come. This program will give communities the necessary resources and tools needed to continue this educational effort on their own far into the future. This program will support the development and implementation of Community Water Festivals in communities where water festivals do not currently exist. The goal will be to connect with 100 - 250 individuals per festival.

TASK 3 – Summer Library Reading Program Activity Books

REVISION requires a reduction of \$1,160 to the task budget. The reduction is due to knowing the true number of Activity Books needed and what the cost of printing and distributing the books will be. The task statement of work does not change.

Description of Task:

The ARBWF/PEPO will support and enhance efforts developed by Colorado Springs to collaborate with additional water entities, develop, and distribute Water Education Activity Books to public libraries throughout the Arkansas River Basin. The activity books already developed by Colorado Springs Utilities focus on local water supplies, the hydrologic cycle, watershed management, storm water management, water conservation and engineering. Through partnerships and outreach, we intent to distribute activity books to libraries throughout the Basin for their summer reading program, which touches tens of thousands of families each year.

Method/Procedure:

2016-2018: Production, Outreach, Collaboration, & Distribution of Activity Books

- Research and develop water education and library partnership across the Basin,
- Develop a schedule of all interested library summer reading programs,
- Collaborate with additional water entities for content,
- Design and print Activity Books,
- Distribute Activity Books to all participating public libraries for their summer reading program,
- Each year, strive to increase the amount of library and water education partnerships,
- Tailor the activity books to meet the educational goals and needs of the Basin, and
- Develop a mechanism to receive feedback/ measure involvement from family members.

Deliverable:

Water Education Activity Books distributed to all interested public library summer reading programs throughout the Arkansas River Basin. Reach tens of thousands of family members through this education vehicle.¹

Task 4- Education to Action Program (Highlighting ArkBIP Identified Planned Projects)

REVISION is an addition to the task Statement of Work to develop and hold meetings (in addition to forums/tours) to promote and educate stakeholders about smaller Ark BIP projects. The task budget was increased by \$3,000.

Revised Description of Task:

The ARBWF, the PEPO Committee and the PEPO Representative of the Executive Committee of the Arkansas Basin will expand on funding received from the PEPO Action Plan to implement the Education to Action Program. This program will support and provide outreach for ArkBIP identified planned projects. The Education to Action Program will annually develop an educational program for ArkBIP identified projects. Once a worthy project has been identified this program could provide educational and informative news releases/articles, informal/formal meetings and/or forums/tours to support or promote the project. Each educational effort will be developed within the context of an overarching understanding of water and sustainability of the economies within the Ark Basin. These collaborative projects will gain exposure, develop partnerships and generate potential funding needed to move the projects forward

towards implementation. Each year will have a theme that is specific to the ArkBIP Goals and will highlight projects that are working to address these issues (2016 will focus on the need for storage).

Revised Method/Procedure

2016-2018: Education to Action Program (each year will include the following)

- ArkBIP identified projects offered at different geographical areas within the Basin
- Work with project sponsor(s) to organize and schedule forums/meetings/tours
- Work with project sponsor(s) to prepare lists of invitees for each meeting/forum/tours
- Secure event centers to hold the meetings/forums/tours •
- Work with project sponsor(s) to develop meeting schedule, outline, and budget •
- Work with project sponsor(s) to prepare press releases/news articles, presentations, discussion • points and information packets
- Provide an outlet for guests where they can find additional information, contact info, sponsor info and how they can get involved
- Provide evening meal for each event if beneficial to the discussion/presentation

Revised Deliverable

The Education to Action Program will work as a platform to bring together key community and government stakeholders to discuss ArkBIP identified projects. It will help gain exposure and support needed to move these projects forward. Across 2016-18, the program will provide outreach for at least 6 projects. Our intent is to provide project sponsors with resources and outreach that will allow them to gain partnerships, to support cooperation and possible funding for their projects. This program will serve as an example of how to use Education to Action to move proposed projects towards implementation. Connect with 50-150 key government and non-government stakeholders at each event.
