33 34 35 36	<u>Welcome and Administrative</u> FC Chair Campbell officially called the meeting to order at 11:03 a.m. Central time. Kenny proceeded with introductions. No agenda modifications offered.	
36 37 38	LaBonde moved to approve the January 22,	2013 FC minutes; Schneider seconded. Minutes approved.
39 40 41 42 43 44	 <u>Sediment Augmentation Contract Change Orders</u> Smith discussed three change orders related to existing contracts for sediment augmentation at the Plum Creek and Cottonwood Ranch complexes. Sellers asked if we are learning which method is most cost effective. Smith said mechanical manipulation at Cottonwood Ranch has proved cheaper over sand pumping so far. Kraus asked if the spring round of implementation is necessary. Smith said yes – the Program will learn more about the effectiveness of the two methods in terms of actually removing 	

45 sediment, and as both methods progress the Program will also learn more about the true comparison of46 costs.

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- Kraus moved to approve the sediment augmentation contract change orders; Sellers seconded. Change 48 orders approved. 49
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Grassland Vegetation Monitoring RFP 51

Smith discussed the RFP for grassland vegetation monitoring. Campbell asked if this would establish the 52 baseline for future evaluation of vegetation. Smith said ves. 53

LaBonde moved to approve the grassland vegetation monitoring RFP; Urie seconded. **RFP approved.**

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56 Water Quality Monitoring Contract Amendment 57

Farnsworth discussed the contract amendment for 2013 water quality monitoring and the focus of water 58 quality monitoring efforts this year. 59

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Urie moved to approve the water quality monitoring contract amendment; Kraus seconded. Contract 61 amendment approved. 62

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Wet Meadows Hydrology Monitoring 64

Kenny discussed the procurement process for items related to wet meadows hydrology monitoring. 65 Kenny said there while debate continues about some of the larger aspects of the wet meadows hydrology 66 monitoring project, there are items that have unanimous support that are moving forward without RFPs 67 and associated selection processes because each piece alone is less than \$25,000. However, taken 68 together they add up to about \$66,000 so Kenny wanted to inform the FC about what was happening. 69 This total cost is well under the budget line item for this project in 2013 (IMRP-2). Kenny then discussed 70 each item – monitoring wells, weather stations, and water level monitoring equipment. Campbell asked 71 about the shallow wells and the cost. Kenny said 27 shallow wells for about \$19,000. Kraus asked if 72 water level monitoring will be installed by April. Kenny said yes. Kraus asked if telemetry will be a 73 separate piece. Kenny said yes, we will come back to the FC to approve a RFP when it is ready. 74 75

Indexing 76

Sellers provided an update on the status of discussions related to indexing. She said Colorado is waiting 77 to hear back from the BOR. Campbell said the issue is in front of the solicitor now, but it doesn't become 78 an issue unless and until a project like the J-2 reservoir comes up and the federal funds are not there to 79 cover the full cost at the time. 80

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Closing Business 82

Kenny asked Campbell if there are any immediate ramifications for the Program if the sequester goes 83 forward. Campbell said the direction he has received is essential travel only and he and Merrill will be at 84 the March GC meeting. But, when possible, he is pushing Merrill to participate in other Advisory 85 Committee meetings by webinar and conference call if possible to reduce travel costs. Kenny asked if 86 that was only for out-of-state travel. Campbell said no it applies to all travel. Kenny said there is a 87 request for a field tour at the conclusion of the GC meeting in March so we need to get a head count of 88 who will attend. Kenny said Smith would be sending a message soon to the GC to get an idea of who 89 plans to participate. 90
