Plum Valley Heights subdistrict of Roxborough Water and Sanitation District (PVHSD) has completed the majority of the project original scope of the NWDC Water Project and the portion funded by a Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) Grant. This project was funded in part by CWCB Grant number CTGG1 2015-3401. As part of the agreement between PVHSD and CWCB a final report is required that summarizes the project once complete.

The project includes providing renewable water service through a centralized potable water distribution system to several existing neighborhoods and an industrial park. This project will provide potable water to approximately 180 residential properties and 30 commercial properties. The infrastructure included in the original scope includes approximately 50,000 LF of 8-inch and 10-inch mainline piping, fire hydrants, three master meter vaults, two pressure reducing vaults and water service lines for the properties being served. Prior to this project the property/homeowners in the project area were on individual wells and the commercial customers were on a common well that served the industrial park.

The project scope has also been increased to add additional mainline piping and reconnect the service lines through the Titan Road Industrial Park (TRIP). This addition is to replace the existing piping that is located in TRIP in order to ensure the commercial customers have a reliable water distribution system. The CWCB Grant was used to fund a portion of the original project scope. The additional scope will not be funded by the CWCB Grant as the other funding sources will be utilized to pay for the additional scope of the project.

The project area is shown on the attached Exhibit 1. The general piping alignment and vault locations are shown in Exhibit 2. Photos are also attached showing some of the construction activities for the pipeline installation and vault installation.

The majority of the original scope of the project has been completed. There are a few service line installations remaining to complete the original scope. The original scope is expected to be complete by end of April 2017. The additional scope for the TRIP is scheduled to begin mid-April 2017 and be complete by July 2017.







