### **Staff Recommendation:**

Staff recommends approval of up to \$10,500 from the Gunnison Basin Account, and \$10,000 from the Statewide Account to help fund the project titled: Wilbur Ditch Diversion Improvement Project.

**Water Activity Summary:** WSRF grant funds, if approved, will assist Trout Unlimited, Escalante Ranch and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service relocate and reconstruct an existing diversion structure and construct a barrier structure in the North Fork of Escalante Creek. The existing facilities suffered failure in 2011. The North Fork of Escalante Creek is home to Colorado River Cutthroat Trout. Construction activities will include installation of a rock weir diversion structure, a headgate and 1,000 feet of 12 diameter pipe. By completing this diversion modification project the lower several miles of this critical habitat for the Colorado River Cutthroat Trout will be accessible and irrigation water will be accessed by valuable senior water rights in a manner that mitigates impacts on native trout.

# **Discussion:** The following goals established by the Gunnison Basin Roundtable in their Basin Implementation Plan will be met by the project:

- 1. Protect existing water rights in the Gunnison Basin
- 5. Quantify and protect environmental and recreational water uses.
- 7. Describe and encourage the beneficial relationship between agriculture and environmental and recreational uses.

8. Restore, maintain, and modernize critical water infrastructure including hydropower.

In addition, this project will help the State of Colorado meet the goals following goals which are listed on page 4 of Chapter 10 of the Water Plan.

- 1. A productive economy that supports vibrant and sustainable cities; viable and productive agriculture; and a robust skiing, recreation, and tourism industry.

- 3. A strong environment that includes healthy watersheds, river, streams and wildlife.

North Fork of Escalante Creek, a tributary to the Gunnison River is home to one of, if not the, largest populations of Colorado River Cutthroat Trout in the Gunnison Basin. The Colorado River Cutthroat Trout (CRCT) occupy only 14% (309 streams) of their historical range in the Upper Colorado River Basin (Hirsch *et al.* 2006, Young 2008). Only 22 streams in the Gunnison Basin support conservation populations, or populations that are 99% pure CRCT lineage. North Fork of Escalante is one of those.

Habitat loss from fragmentation and introduction of non-native species are the largest contributing factors to the CRCT population decline. The population of CRCT on North Fork of Escalante have been protected since the late 1800's by an irrigation diversion structure Creek that serves as a partial barrier. Other factors including water temperatures have protected CRCT in their 18-mile range on North Fork of Escalante Creek.

Trout Unlimited with funding from USFS and Colorado Parks and Wildlife and assistance from Bureau of Land Management and Escalante Ranch will be completing a barrier in concert with a diversion modification before the spring of 2019 to completely protect this population of native trout from non-native species.

The Escalante Ranch owns the Wilbur ditch which has historically diverted water from North Fork of Escalante Creek approximately 3 miles upstream of the barrier that will be constructed. The Wilbur Ditch diversion, which was a sizeable earthen and rock structure, washed out in 2011. Escalante Ranch has made attempts at reconstructing the diversion and recently contacted Trout Unlimited about constructing a diversion that allow for access water for irrigation and reduce impacts on the stream.

Along with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Trout Unlimited and Escalante Ranch plan to move the diversion point of the ditch upstream approximately 400 feet, install a rock weir diversion structure along with a headgate and 1000 feet of 12-inch pipe.

By completing this diversion modification project; the lower several miles of this critical habitat for the CRCT will be accessible and irrigation water will be accessed by valuable senior water rights in a manner that mitigates impacts on native trout.



The CWCB may withhold reimbursement until satisfactory progress reports have been submitted.

Final Report: At completion of the project, the grantee shall provide the CWCB a Final Report on the grantee's letterhead that:

- Summarizes the project and how the project was completed.
- Describes any obstacles encountered, and how these obstacles were overcome.
- Confirms that all matching commitments have been fulfilled.
- Includes photographs, summaries of meetings and engineering reports/designs.

#### **Payments**

Payment will be made based on actual expenditures, must include invoices for all work completed and must be on grantee's letterhead. The request for payment must include a description of the work accomplished by task, an estimate of the percent completion for individual tasks and the entire Project in relation to the percentage of budget spent, identification of any major issues, and proposed or implemented corrective actions.

The CWCB will pay the last 10% of the entire water activity budget when the Final Report is completed to the satisfaction of CWCB staff. Once the Final Report has been accepted, and final payment has been issued, the water activity and purchase order or contract will be closed without any further payment. Any entity that fails to complete a satisfactory Final Report and submit to CWCB within 90 days of the expiration of a purchase order or contract may be denied consideration for future funding of any type from CWCB.

### **Performance Requirements**

Performance measures for this contract shall include the following:

(a) Performance standards and evaluation: Grantee will produce detailed deliverables for each task as specified. Grantee shall maintain receipts for all project expenses and documentation of the minimum inkind contributions (if applicable) per the budget in Exhibit B. Per Grant Guidelines, the CWCB will pay out the last 10% of the budget when the final deliverable is completed to the satisfaction of CWCB staff. Once the final deliverable has been accepted, and final payment has been issued, the purchase order or grant will be closed without any further payment.

(b) Accountability: Per the Grant Guidelines full documentation of project progress must be submitted with each invoice for reimbursement. Grantee must confirm that all grant conditions have been complied with on each invoice. In addition, per the Grant Guidelines, Progress Reports must be submitted at least once every 6 months. A Final Report must be submitted and approved before final project payment. (c) Monitoring Requirements: Grantee is responsible for ongoing monitoring of project progress per Exhibit A. Progress shall be detailed in each invoice and in each Progress Report, as detailed above. Additional inspections or field consultations will be arranged as may be necessary.

(d) Noncompliance Resolution: Payment will be withheld if grantee is not current on all grant conditions. Flagrant disregard for grant conditions will result in a stop work order and cancellation of the Grant Agreement.

The CWCB will pay the last 10% of the entire water activity budget when the Final Report is completed to the satisfaction of the CWCB staff project manager. Once the Final Report has been accepted, the final payment has been issued, the water activity and purchase order (PO) or contract will be closed without any futher payment. Any entity that fails to complete a satisfactory Final Report and submit to the CWCB with 90 days of the expiration of the PO or contract may be denied consideration for future funding of any type from the CWCB.

Additonally, the applicant shall provide a progress report every 6 months, beginning from the date of contract execution


• Standard contracting proceedures dictate that the Expiration Date of the contract shall be 5 years from the Effective Date.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Colorado Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program (CO PFW) strongly supports the Wilbur Ditch Diversion Restoration and Fish Screen Project. CO PFW is actively working in partnership with the private landowner and Trout Unlimited in support of this project. This includes providing both technical assistance and committing financial assistance in order eliminate entrainment and improve passage for native Colorado River Cutthroat Trout, while improving water delivery for the private landowner. Over the long-term this project will also reduce stream sediment, thus improving water quality, improve the landowner's ability to efficiently manage irrigation, as well as maintain conditions beneficial to the native fishery. This project is also bolstered by a barrier project occurring approximately one mile downstream that will ensure non-native fishes do not encroach upstream in to this native fishery.
