RE: Colorado Water Resources & Power Development Authority - Director's Report

#### Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (WPCRF)

There are currently thirteen (13) loans in process for approximately \$53.7 million. The loan capacity for the program in 2019 is approximately \$100 million. HJR 19 - 1005, the joint resolution that modifies our project eligibility list, has been signed by the Governor. The modified project eligibility list contains 283 projects for an estimated need of \$8.9 billion.

### **Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWRF)**

There are currently three (3) loans in process for \$28.5 million. The loan capacity for the program in 2019 is approximately \$75 million. HJR 19 - 1005, the joint resolution that modifies our project eligibility list, has been signed by the Governor. The modified project eligibility list contains 350 projects for an estimated need of over \$9 billion.

# **Water Revenue Bonds**

We continue our meetings with participants in the Windy Gap Firming Project and the Northern Integrated Supply Project regarding financing options.

# <u>Animas – La Plata Project</u>

The Authority still holds 284 ac/ft of depletion that is under contract with the Animas La Plata Water Conservancy District for purchase in installments. The District has purchased 416 ac/ft. to date. Along with the ALPWCD and the City of Durango, we are working with the Bureau of Reclamation on final cost allocations.

# **CWCB – Authority Joint Funding Opportunities**

We continue the efforts of the Statewide Funding Committee and work with CWCB staff to investigate viable funding mechanisms for future water projects.

## **Authority Legislative Matters**

The Governor has reappointed Bob Wolff to serve as the representative from the San Miguel/Dolores/San Juan drainage basins and has appointed Chris Treese to serve as the representative from the main Colorado drainage basin. Their appointments are pending a vote in the Senate.
