Colorado Open Lands requested and was awarded \$36,200 from the Rio Grande Basin Roundtable Basin account to provide the needed matching funds to purchase a conservation easement on the Anderson Lazy EA Ranch. This 164.5 acre working ranch has significant senior water rights and is part of an important agricultural corridor.

The conservation easement tied 1.4 cfs of Pinos Creek water rights to the property. This includes 1 cfs from the Robran, where the ranch is the first on the ditch and .3 cfs from the Little Anna where the ranch is the last to receive water. Conservation of this ranch keeps the existing hydrology intact, which ensures return flows to downstream users and the river.

This water right provides flood irrigation to 60 acres of alfalfa and grass mix and 80 acres of wet meadow. The remainder of the property is riparian area and remains productive due to sub-irrigation and ensures that the existence of this important wildlife corridor that supports deer, elk, bear, raptors and the southwest willow flycatcher.

This project is an important addition in preserving the ranching landscape and the historic water use patterns along the Rio Grande and by reducing the threat of encroaching subdivisions.

All due diligence and final deed of conservation easement was completed and the conservation easement closed on March 25, 2019.
