IN THE MATTER OF STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS FOR AN INSTREAM FLOW APPROPRIATION ON TROUT CREEK BETWEEN THE CONFLUENCE WITH AN UNNAMED TRIBUTARY AND THE KOLL DITCH HEADGATE, WATER DIVISION 6

It has come to the attention of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the Colorado Water Conservation Board that the prehearing order does not accurately represent the time allocations requested by the BLM. Specifically, the BLM verbally requested 40 minutes to present its case in chief, and 15 minutes for rebuttal, but the hearing order specifies that BLM will receive only 25 minutes for its case in chief.

BLM moves to modify the hearing order to specify that at the hearing, BLM will be allocated 40 minutes to present its case in chief and 15 minutes to provide rebuttal testimony.
