## Content Overview

- The current list of interviewees encompasses many different watersheds and regions including Pueblo, Yampa River, San Luis Valley, Arkansas River, Denver Metro area, and Northern Water.
- Many perspectives and stories have been shared about the basin roundtables and the Inter-basin Compact Committee, the Colorado Water Plan, various water projects, irrigation best practices, water law cases, municipal compared to agricultural water usage, eastern/western slope relations, and many more topics.
- The educational videos so far have focused on recreational in-channel diversions, collaboration/cooperation, and agriculture's impact on Colorado water policy.

### Public Benefit

- Educational videos will be incorporated into curriculums for PHA's volunteer training initiatives, youth outreach efforts, and other programs
- Information, anecdotes, and opinions from these water leaders have been captured and preserved for long-term access and use

## Next steps

- PHA may create an educational video based off of Mike Shimmin's interview and/or develop a water-law/prior appropriation themed video utilizing footage from all the interviewees
- PHA is working with the Poudre Runs Through It Group to fund and interview MaryLou
   Smith and other Poudre-related individuals before the end of 2019
- The additional Colorado Water Plan grant will notify awardees by December 2019. If PHA and the CSU Water Resources Archive receive the grant from the Colorado Water Conservation Board, then we will be able to complete 10-14 more interviews
