For fiscal year 2020, the Agricultural Project category received \$1.75 million in funding. The unreserved balance in the agriculture category is \$1,752,598, including carryover funds from fiscal year 2019. In the first round of fiscal year 2020 applications, the CWCB received 7 applications totaling \$1,162,084. Staff is recommending seven projects totaling \$1,162,084 leaving \$590,514 available for the second round.
