Background:

Staff's review of the applications involves the following steps:

- 1) Applications are reviewed for completeness based on the information requirements, which are primarily outlined in the Criteria and Guidelines (C&G)
- 2) Applications are reviewed to verify that the water activity meets the eligibility requirements in Section 39-29-108 (III) C.R.S. (C&G, Part 2) and the threshold criteria, which are based on the requirements of Section 39-29-108 (III) C.R.S.,



- and two sections of the Water for the 21st Century Act (House Bill 1177); Section 37-75-102 and Section 37-75-104(2)(c) (C&G, Part 3). Staff also verifies that the applicant was an eligible entity to receive funding (C&G, Part 2).
- 3) Staff then prepares the Water Activity Summary Sheet which documents the outcome of the review process and contains staff's recommendations.

Water Supply Reserve Fund Balance Summary and Project Status Report: To provide the Board updates on the status of specific Water Supply Reserve Fund grant applications and projects, staff can provide a status report of the following information upon request:

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$33,500 from the Gunnison Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Boles and Manny Ditch Infrastructure Improvement Project.

Water Activity Summary: WSRF grant funds, if approved, will assist Trout Unlimited and the Boles and Manny Ditch water users address aging infrastructure and deferred maintenance by installing new infrastructure including: in-river diversion weir; headgate; measurement weir; and control structures in the proper locations at the heading of the ditch. This work will include grading and placement of material adjacent to the Uncompahgre River that will promote healthy riparian growth and stabilized banks. Contractors will also spread native seed mix on disturbed areas. These initial improvements will allow water users to access water for all lands under the ditch, which is not now possible. The water users intend to contract with an engineer to complete a ditch-wide assessment, which will guide future improvements including lining, piping and other upgrades related to water efficiency and salinity control.

Discussion: This effort will assist the Gunnison Basin Roundtable meet the goals 5, 7 & 8 of their Basin Implementation Plan by: protecting environmental and recreational water uses; encourage beneficial relationship between agricultural and environmental & recreational water uses; and restoring and modernizing infrastructure.

Issues/Additional Needs: The applicant must provide all outstanding letters of matching commitment prior to entering into a grant contract with the state, otherwise no issues or additional needs have been identified.

Eligibility Requirements: The application meets requirements of all eligibility components: General Eligibility, Entity Eligibility, Water Activity Eligibility, and Eligibility Based on Match Requirements.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$54,800 from the Gunnison Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Cedar Mesa Ditch Piping Project.

Water Activity Summary: WSRF grant funds, if approved, will assist Cedar Mesa Ditch Company replace 3,000 feet of existing open ditch with 21" PVC irrigation pipe. Completion of this project will improve irrigation delivery efficiency and reduce salt loading by 900 tons. The current effort represents Phase 1 of a 3-phase project. Cedar Mesa Ditch is supplied from Surface Creek which, in turn, is fed by numerous reservoirs on the grand Mesa. The 12-mile ditch supplies irrigation water to 1043 acres through 37 head-gates. It serves 64 shareholders who raise cattle, hay, peaches, apples, plums, apricots and grapes. The lower part of the ditch runs thought Mancos Shale where seepage is the greatest. It is estimated that piping the lower 3.5 miles of the ditch will recover 60% of the shrink (seepage). Shrink is estimated at 50% in 2018 and this year.

Discussion: This effort will assist the Gunnison Basin Roundtable meet the goals of their Basin Implementation Plan by assisting the Roundtable in achieving the completion of a Tier 1 Project.

Issues/Additional Needs: The applicant must also gain the CWCB's approval of a Water Plan Grant in the amount of \$35,000 scheduled to go before the CWCB in July 2020 (if this grant fails to gain approval by the CWCB, the applicant must provide a documented substitute funding source), otherwise no issues or additional needs have been identified.

Eligibility Requirements: The application meets requirements of all eligibility components: General Eligibility, Entity Eligibility, Water Activity Eligibility, and Eligibility Based on Match Requirements.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$50,000 from the Gunnison Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Vouga Reservoir Repair.

Water Activity Summary: WSRF grant funds, if approved, will assist R&K Straheli Farms rehabilitate the Vouga Reservoir by replacing the upslope dam embankment, which has deteriorate over time due to wave erosion, thus placing the storage capacity under restriction by the State Engineer's Office. The proposed repair work will satisfy requirements necessary to lift the imposed restriction and bring the reservoir storage back to full capacity.

Discussion: This effort will assist the Gunnison Basin Roundtable meet their goals of protecting existing uses and improving agricultural water supplies as identified in the Gunnison Basin Implementation Plan, and assist the state in maintaining existing water storage capacity as called for in the Colorado Water Plan.

Issues/Additional Needs: None.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$19,000 from the Gunnison Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Upper Gunnison Multiple Diversion Improvement Project.

Water Activity Summary: WSRF grant funds, if approved, will assist Trout Unlimited and the various land and irrigation infrastructure owners modernize existing water diversion systems that are antiquated and difficult to operate, including dams that require regular maintenance that contribute to channel erosion during high flow periods. In addition, three of the four diversion structures do not effectively divert water during low flow periods. The new structures (headgates, ditches, diversion dams, sluice gates, and stabilize existing ditch banks) will be constructed to eliminate the need for regular in-channel disturbance and allow access to decreed water rights at a range of flow levels. Structure design will also provide quality aquatic habitat and refuge for trout. These four diversions are used to divert water to over 1000 acres of grass pasture and hay meadow in the Gunnison Basin. A total of 16 individual water right owners will benefit from this project. Each site will include localized riparian and habitat restoration that will total approximately 1,000 feet.

Discussion: This effort will assist the Gunnison Basin Roundtable meet goals 1 & 6 of their Basin Implementation Plan by: protecting existing uses; maintain or, where necessary, improve water quality throughout the Gunnison Basin, in addition to assisting the state's goal to "Support the development of multipurpose projects and methods that benefit environmental and recreational water needs as well as water needs for communities or agriculture" as called for in the Colorado Water Plan.

Issues/Additional Needs: The grantee must obtain and submit all outstanding letters of matching commitment prior to entering into a grant contract with the state (if the applicant is unable to obtain matching commitments for those indicated in the application and budget they must provide a documented substitute funding source), otherwise no issues or additional needs have been identified.

Eligibility Requirements: The application meets requirements of all eligibility components: General Eligibility, Entity Eligibility, Water Activity Eligibility, and Eligibility Based on Match Requirements.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$22,260 from the Southwest Basin Account to help fund the project: Upper Road 42 Water Extension Phase 1 – Feasibility Study.

Water Activity Summary: WSRF Funds, if approved will assist the Upper Road 42 Water Association in their efforts to design, construct, and install an extension of the Mancos Rural Water Company water system in order to provide domestic water to 27 properties from Road N north to the Forest Service Boundary on County Road 42 in Mancos, Colorado. The proposed project includes: An above-ground pump station located at the top of Jackson dam on Road N (Option A) or at the Mancos Rural Water treatment plant, located at the base of the Jackson Lake dam (Option B). Approximately 12,000 ft of 4" C900 pipe, installed in the utility easement and bar ditch on the south side of Road N and west side of Road 42 extending from the new pump station east along Road N and north to the Forest Service boundary on Road 42. A new 20,000 gallon above-ground polypropylene or steel water storage tank located on the northwest corner of Connie and Huston Anderson's property. The WSRF funding will be used to pay for Phase 1 of the project: preliminary engineering of the system, a feasibility study, and costs associated with the formation of an Improvement District for the project.

Discussion: This effort will assist the Southwest Basin Roundtable meet the Goals and Measurable Outcomes to "Provide safe drinking water to Southwest Colorado's citizens and visitors" as described in their Basin Implementation Plan and the SWBRT Chair's Recommendation Letter.

Issues/Additional Needs: None.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$10,000 from the Yampa/White/Green Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Drescher Dam Rehabilitation – Engineering Design.

Water Activity Summary: WSRF grant funds, if approved, will assist Nicholas and Ann Charchalis obtain an engineering design solution to the current fill restriction and to perform immediate risk reduction measures (rehabilitation) on the existing dam, such as placing riprap on the emergency spillway, and mitigate rodent burrows in the dam. Current production is approximately 70 ac irrigated alfalfa. Once all repairs and approvals are complete irrigated acres will increase to 120 under pivot and an additional 30 ac in a new sideroll system totaling 150 ac.

Discussion: This effort will assist the Yampa/White/Green Basin Roundtable meet the goals of: "Maintenance of Historical Use, Protection of Water Supplies for Future Demands, and Environmental Protection"; "Protect and encourage agricultural uses of water in the YWG Basin within the context of private property rights"; "Improve agricultural water supplies to increase irrigated land and reduce shortages"; and "Restore, maintain, and modernize water storage and distribution infrastructure" as called for in the Yampa/White/Green Basin implementation Plan.

Issues/Additional Needs: None.
