Background:

For this agenda item, the Board is provided with a brief overview of applications to the Water Supply Reserve Fund (WSRF). Attachments to this memo include:

- Summary spreadsheet displaying current WSRF Balance Summary of Fund Appropriations and Receipts by Fiscal Year, and Fund Distribution by Basin and Statewide Account.
- Water Activity Summary Sheets, which provide an overview, discussion, issues/additional needs, and staff recommendation regarding funding, partial funding, or not funding the applications.

Staff's review of the applications involves the following steps:

- Applications are reviewed for completeness based on the information requirements, which are primarily outlined in the Criteria and Guidelines (C&G).
- 2) Applications are reviewed to verify that the water activity meets the eligibility requirements in Section 39-29-108 (III) C.R.S. (C&G, Part 2) and the threshold criteria, which are based on the requirements of Section 39-29-108 (III) C.R.S., and two sections of the Water for the 21st Century Act (House Bill 1177);



Section 37-75-102 and Section 37-75-104(2)(c) (C&G, Part 3). Staff also verifies that the applicant was an eligible entity to receive funding (C&G, Part 2).

3) Staff then prepares the Water Activity Summary Sheet which documents the outcome of the review process and contains staff's recommendations.

Water Supply Reserve Fund Balance Summary and Project Status Report: To provide the Board updates on the status of specific Water Supply Reserve Fund grant applications and projects, staff can provide a status report of the following information upon request:

- List of completed WSRF projects;
- List of WSRF projects in progress; and
- List of WSRF projects in the contracting and procurement process.

In January 2012 interest for the program from its inception to date was credited directly to the Statewide Account.

Interest from January 2012 on is regularly calculated by the Treasury and credited to the Statewide Account.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$11,342 from the North Platte Basin Account to help fund the project: Hydrographic Survey of Meadow Creek Reservoir

Water Activity Summary: If approved, grant funds would be used for a Hydrographic Survey of Meadow Creek Reservoir to determine the current volume of water stored in the reservoir. The reservoir has a storage right for 5,000 acre feet, and shares in the reservoir amount to 4,200 acre feet. By identifying how much water the reservoir contains beyond what is already allocated, the applicant will be able to meet other water demands among current and new shareholders. Currently, Meadow Creek Reservoir supplies 3,000 acre feet to irrigated pasture along Michigan Creek, and 1,200 acre feet to the City of Fort Collins for municipal use.

The underwater survey will use hydrographic survey vessels and sonic depth recording equipment interfaced with a real-time GPS that provides continuous sounding positions throughout the underwater portion of the reservoir covered by the survey vessel. The survey system software continuously records reservoir depths and horizontal coordinates as the survey boat moves along closely-spaced grid lines covering the reservoir area. The survey vessels guidance system gives directions to the boat operator to assist in maintaining the course along these predetermined lines.

For the analysis orthographic aerial images will be used from the USDA data web site to find surface areas and develop reservoir contours. This data, along with the hydrographic sonar data are then used to develop storage-elevation relationships using area-capacity computer programming.

Discussion: The applicant suggests this study will assist the North Platte Basin Roundtable and the Water Plan in achieving the goal to enhance and maintain storage within the basin.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of up to \$8,000 from the Colorado Basin Account to help fund the project titled: Lateral Ditch ML47 lateral Improvement Project

Water Activity Summary: The applicant would use WSRF Funds to replace a 44 year old, degraded concrete irrigation ditch and construct a approximately pressurized underground pipe system. Both the main lateral and several sub laterals will be piped.

The water source is from the Grand Valley Irrigation Company (GVIC) canal system. There are 340 GVIC shares assigned to Lateral ML47. The lateral serves approximately 350 acres irrigating crops which include, alfalfa, corn, grass hay, and lawns. There are 27 turnouts on the system. Approximately 24 of these are agricultural turnouts and 3 are residential turnouts. Approximately 14,680 feet of pipe will be installed. No dedicated habitat improvements will be installed, however lands disturbed by construction will be reseeded.

The applicant expects deep percolation and surface return flows to the Colorado River will decrease and they estimate this may cause a decrease in salinity load and may improve habitat for endangered fish species in the river.

Discussion: The proposed piping project is consistent with the Roundtable's Basin Implementation Plan and Colorado's Water Plan as it supports viable agricultural production and allows the company to continue to receive more efficient delivery of its pre-Compact water rights.
