## Staff Review and Comments:

Staff received 14 applications by the December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 deadline. Staff initially conduct a red-flag review of each application to determine whether the grant complies with all current CWCB policies and guidelines concerning grant awards.

CWCB staff, following the initial red-flag review, score all agricultural viability applications according to the Colorado Water Plan Grant Program criteria and guidelines and agriculture category-specific criteria, with input from a grant review committee. The grant review committee consists of Colorado Water Conservation Board staff in consultation with the Colorado Department of Agriculture, Colorado Department of Public Health and the Environment, and Colorado Parks and Wildlife staff.

The review committee evaluates agricultural grants on several criteria, including whether the project furthers critical action items identified in the Colorado Water Plan; whether the project promotes collaboration; the overall impact of the project on a regional or state-wide scale; whether the project is identified in a Basin Implementation Plan or other watershed plans; whether the project enhances resiliency and viability of agriculture and food systems; and whether the project provides an innovative, multi-benefit approach to solving critical water resource challenges affecting Colorado agriculture, food systems, and rural communities. In light of state budget challenges, staff also considers whether the proposed project will significantly leverage non-CWCB funding. Staff also considers all letters of support included with the application.

## **Project Issues/Additional Needs**

- All funding awards are contingent upon the applicants' ability to secure match funding within a reasonable period, based on their continued efforts to secure match funding.
- Grantees should adequately address CWCB staff comments to scopes of work and
  engineering designs (when applicable) before contracting. This may result in changes,
  especially in the case of partial funding awards. Staff will schedule meetings with each
  successful applicant to discuss comments and contracting procedures.
