Summary of Water Court Application

Application for a change of water right.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board ratify the filing of a Statement of Opposition filed on behalf of the Board in May 2021 to protect CWCB's instream flow water rights.

CWCB Instream Flow Water Rights

The CWCB holds many instream flow water rights in Water Division 3. One or more instream flow water rights could be injured by this application.

Potential for Injury


- The CWCB holds many instream flow water rights in Water Division 3. One or more instream flow water rights could be injured by this application. The application, however, lacks sufficient detail for the CWCB to adequately assess which instream flow water rights might be injured or the extent to which any instream flow water rights might be injured.
- The proposed change of water rights could cause an expansion of use or otherwise alter the time, place, and amount of historical return flows. Such expansion or alteration could injure one or more of the CWCB's instream flow water rights. The application lacks sufficient detail for the CWCB to adequately assess whether use will be expanded, or historical return flows might be impacted, and where impacts might occur.
- Terms and conditions should be included in any decree entered in this case to ensure that the CWCB's instream flow water rights will not be injured.

Other Objectors

Statements of Opposition were also filed by Colorado Parks and Wildlife, and San Luis Valley Irrigation District.

Dickey located on Trout Creek a tributary of the South Fork of the Rio Grande (located within T39N, R3E, NMPM,; 2. Crestone View Farms – Terry Good (located within T41N, R7E and R8E, NMPM) irrigated through the Rio Grande Canal; 3. Rock Paulson (fields generally located in T40N, R7E, NMPM) and irrigated through the Rio Grande Canal; 4. Owners of land irrigated under the SRS Plan for Augmentation decreed in case No. 82CW17 (located within T40N, R6E, NMPM). 5. Chet Nash, Owner Antelope Warm Springs Ranch and the reservoir located in the NE4 Section 12, T40N, R2 West N.M.P.M. Filling of reservoir and replacement of non - augmented evaporation. 6. Trinchera Water Conservancy District: Groundwater Management Subdistrict. Replacement of injurious depletion to the Rio Grande River from non-exempt well use in the Trinchera Subdistrict. 7. Additional or alternative lessees are possible in the future.

Applicants continue to use a small portion of the water to irrigate 29 acres of land owned by the Applicants and referred to as their "Del Norte Property". The location of the Applicants' 29 acres of land is within a fraction of the NE1/4, Section 19, Township 40 North, Range 7 East, NMPM. This property receives water through Lateral 1C of the Rio Grande Canal. *Land ownership*: The United States of America (Rio Grande National Forest) is the owner of the land on which the reservoirs are located.
