Metro Roundtable Business Meeting

Mark Shea with Colorado Springs Utilities and the Arkansas Basin Chair presented policy statements on forest management issues and the Colorado Forest Service Alliance. They focus on identifying policy issues and challenges to active forest management. They have developed policy statements on areas of need and opportunity. The documents were shared in the meeting packet. Asking MRT to consider endorsing the policy statement. MRT will discuss at the October meeting.

Action: Adopt MRT revised WSRF Guidelines

It was moved by Lisa Darling and seconded by Ken Lykens to approve the revised WSRF Guidelines as presented; motion carried unanimously.

7. Demand Management MRT Panel Discussion (Jessica Brody, Robert Sakata, Sean Chambers) (30 min.)

We want a dialogue that supports all of Colorado and advocating for what is best for the entire state. The value of the Colorado river water is vast and it's imperative we have a high level of water knowledge, both consumptive and non-consumptive, and how the diversions are operated. Water supply is of fundamental interest to municipalities in north and northeast Colorado. Understanding the details of the analysis has been the focus. The workplan involves a series of meetings to come into alignment on key facts and then best articulate our position on Demand Management as a program. Drought contingency needs to be considered every year from a water provider standpoint. Providers also have a responsibility to the state understanding the limited resources.

The hydrology is getting worse and close to not functioning according to design. The Demand Management program was created to help us forestall this issue. The program may or may not work. There may be opportunities to apply these concepts in other scenarios. The workgroup wants to address how we might do better beyond just the administration of the resources. How can we use

water resources most efficiently and effectively? We are using this work group process as an opportunity to identify what needs to be addressed down the road.

All feedback is being captured and compiled and has been since the start of the workgroup process. Process is important to ensure everyone is being heard. Many separate steps will need to happen before it can be implemented. The Upper Colorado River Commission must act first. The Demand Management tool will be available regardless of whether we use it now. We can only control our process and we need to be flexible. The goal is to get to a logical end point of the process and establish timeframes to answer the questions we can answer, and what next steps may look like at the appropriate time. On August 18th the CWCB will be having a Demand Management workshop. Once there is a link, it will be added to the CWCB calendar.

8. BIP Update (Matt Cook) (30 min.)

Reviewed the distinction between Volume I and Volume II. Volume II is the more in-depth document and is customized to each basin. Section overviews were provided. The presentation is available by request.

9. CWCB Update (Sam Stein) (5 min.)
