

Upper Basin 5-Point plan

System Conservation Pilot Program

- Reauthorization through federal legislation
- Temporary, voluntary, compensated

2023 Drought Response Operations Plan

- Expedited process
- Start planning August 2022 \rightarrow Final plan April 2023

Demand Management Feasibility Investigation

- Continuation of feasibility investigation
- New information Fall 2022

Bipartisan Infrastructure Funding

- Use of bipartisan infrastructure law funds
- Enhanced measurement, monitoring, reporting

Strict Water Rights Administration

- Administer water rights pursuant to legal and physical availability
- Intrastate conservation efforts



Watershed Protection	100%	variable	0%	0%

Municipal/Industrial Water	0%	up to 50%	0%	0%

"Variable" = must not exceed the rate for other NRCS/USDA programs






