QUESTIONS ABOUT FUNDING TO MITIGATE DROUGHT?

Opportunity for free advice for <u>your</u> Colorado utility on potential drought funding and mitigation projects

One-stop shop of government funding agencies and experts

Even with recent heavy snow, a long-running drought continues to create both short- and long-term challenges in Colorado, contributing to potential cascading disasters including wildfires, floods, and landslides. What can water and wastewater utilities do, especially small and overburdened utilities?

Who is providing help? U.S. EPA is coordinating with federal and state partners to offer a one-stop shop to help water and wastewater utilities with identifying possible drought mitigation strategies, as well as to help utilities understand the types of funding available to mitigate drought and who to contact if they want to get started.

What types of drought projects could be eligible? Aquifer storage and recovery, groundwater replenishment, green infrastructure, deeper wells, infiltration wells, water reuse, alternative water sources, floodplain and stream restoration, flood diversion and storage, water loss audits, leak detection projects, etc. Nature-based solutions are especially encouraged.
