#### Water Project Justification

The project will provide the following benefits:

1. Increase the resiliency of the Districts ability to provide a reliable potable water supply during a drought or other water supply emergency.

2. Provide a framework for the District to respond to a water supply shortage and communicate to the public and District's customers.

3. Recommend water conservation efforts including voluntary and mandatory restrictions based on the severity of the drought.

4. Minimize the adverse effects of a water supply emergency on public health, economic activity, environmental resources, and individual lifestyles.
