To create momentum for statewide turf removal, Resource Central seeks to catalyze transformative landscape change, expand outreach and implementation to the Western Slope, and pilot new, innovative water conservation

solutions across Colorado communities. We will implement residential turf removal and replacement in partnership with 20+ metro water partners and engage new partners across the state through a multi-year matching fund, and pilot innovative efforts to address barriers to large-scale turf replacement.

Water Project Justification

To support implementation of the Colorado Water Plan, conservation organization Resource Central is poised to scale our landscape transformation programs and engage new partners in the Western Slope to build statewide capacity for voluntary replacement of irrigated turf. As turf replacement increasingly becomes part of Colorado's solution to water scarcity, we will lead implementation and build capacity to support DIY efforts, share best practices, and pilot innovative solutions to build momentum for turf replacement and create lasting water savings. With additional funding, Resource Central's goal is to incentivize water providers statewide to sustainably grow their conservation programs and help create demand by demonstrating the ease, efficiency, and beauty of Waterwise landscaping. This project seeks to engage all sectors in landscape change programs, including water utilities, residents, businesses, and the landscaping industry.

Related Studies

The Turf Replacement Bill (HB-1151) is the main driver of this project, highlighting the importance of turf replacement as a permanent solution to conserving water by promoting efficient use and minimizing water waste. This grant will leverage funding allocated by HB-1151 to support investments already made to water utilities, streamline consistent funding over the next three years to create demand and implement turf replacement, and build capacity statewide to amplify the impact of future CWCB investments.
