The Watershed Stewards Program leverages the benefits of national service to 1) support community engagement in the water field, 2) increase the capacity of water-focused organizations, and 3) train a skilled incoming water workforce. Funding is being requested from the Colorado Water Plan Grant to be able to recruit, train, and retain qualified AmeriCorps Watershed Stewards. These specific program components are critical to ensure quality service delivery and meaningful member experience.

## **Water Project Justification**

The project objectives for the are to recruit, train, and retain at least 30 AmeriCorps Watershed Stewards by the end of 2026. AmeriCorps is a great tool to leverage resources, foster cross sector-collaborations, and prepare a new generation of leaders. The Watershed Stewards Program aligns with many objectives identified in various local, regional, and state planning documents. "Tools" identified in the Colorado Water Plan being utilized in the program are: 1) Public outreach and education, 2) Collaboration, 3) Innovation, and 4) Equity.

The Watershed Stewards Program mirrors many project ideas listed in the Colorado Water Plan Partner Actions handout. With focused attention on community engagement and education activities, the Watershed Stewards Program will support vibrant communities, robust agriculture, thriving watersheds, and resilient planning. Additionally, the program will empower residents to participate in citizen science and community stewardship events, and engage with local watershed groups, thereby fostering collaboration across sectors and communities. Through its various components, the program provides opportunities for individuals to explore water career paths and will provide opportunities for community members to actively participate in educational programs, aligning with the overarching goal of enhancing Colorado's water communication, outreach, and public engagement efforts.

The program supports goals outlined in the Arkansas Basin Implementation Plan, including 1. environment and recreation objectives around maintaining or improving habitat (including wetlands), 2. watershed health goals around water quality, and 3. supports the roundtable's Public Education, Participation, and Outreach mission to "inform, engage, and educate citizens about local water resources."
