# 2. Project Presentation - Rubicon Water "Smart Irrigation Gates"

• Rubicon Water presented on their company, the irrigation gate product, and the needs which brought the product to fruition. The company was formed in Australia in the early 2000s and moved to the USA markets in 2006, and their products are used worldwide. Their products include the "OVERshot Gates" where water flows over the top of the "Flumegate", the "UNDERshot Gates" which allows control and/or metering of the flows, and specialty gates which can be used for pipes. The benefits of the Rubicon systems is that gates are automated and the canals are balanced. More information may be found at

### Arkansas River Watershed Collaborative – Jonathan Paklaian

Jonathan reported that ARWC hired an additional person in Summit County. 2024 fundraising support from Arkansas Basin Conservation Cooperative for \$15,000. Aurora Water provided support as well, and Lake County Government provided \$50,000 of support. ARWC will meet with Colorado Springs Utilities next week. Colorado Gives Day was last Tuesday, and ARWC received over \$1,000. ARWC is now also receiving recurring monthly contributions for the first time. ARWC Board meeting will be on Friday December 15<sup>th</sup>.
