









SNOW WATER EQUIVALENT IN YAMPA-WHITE-LITTLE SNAKE






PRECIPITATION ACCUMULATION IN YAMPA-WHITE-LITTLE SNAKE



























Summary

- Statewide snowpack is 92% of median. Early January storms provided a needed boost, but didn't quite provide enough to make a lasting improvement given the preexisting deficit.
- In a normal year Colorado is typically accumulated about 50% of it's median annual peak snowpack.
- Statewide reservoir storage is 100% of median
- Statewide precipitation is 91% of median. Ranging from 74% in the SMDASJ to 105% in the Upper Colorado.
