Metro Roundtable Business Meeting

1. Welcome/Introductions (1 min.)

The meeting was called to order by Chair Lisa Darling at 2:03 pm.

2. Approval of April 11, 2024, Meeting Summary (1 min.)

It was moved to approve the April 11, 2024, MRT Meeting Summary. Motion approved by acclamation.

 - Election of chairpersons There was discussion of adding a second Vice-chair to improve the succession process. There was a request for those who want to stand for the Executive Committee positions. Those who stood are listed below.

A motion was made by Kim Gortz to nominate those standing to be elected to the positions listed and was seconded by Devon Buckels. The motion carried.

2. Election of new members

The (1) City/county, (2) municipal, (3) water conservancy/conservation district, (4) legislative appointed members appoint the 18 at large members. There was discussion on the overage of At-large positions based on legislative allocation. It was suggested that MRT hold on the election to confer with CWCB and bring recommendations back to the MRT. The intent of the legislation is to assign a designated number of seats to bring balance to the discussions. Atlarge seats and non-voting seats have 5 year terms. Those appointed to seats hold the seats until they step down.

7. Drought Resilience Project Update (Greg Peterson, Colorado Ag Water Alliance) (25 min.) A presentation was provided on the status of current projects and projects continuing from last year. The presentation is available by request.

8. Legislative Update (Kelly Romero-Heaney, DNR Representative) (10 min.)

1 State Issues - Colorado Water Congress (cowatercongress.org)

A final legislative update was provided of the General Assembly session as it pertained to water. Key highlights were presented on the HB24 - 1435 CWCB projects bill with a breakdown on the funding requests for various projects and programs. The sports betting bill will be on the ballot due to revenues extending beyond Tabor limits. This will determine if the State can keep the money or not. A press release from DNR will be distributed to MRT when it becomes available. SB24 - 005 Concerning the conservation of water in the state through the prohibition of certain landscaping practices became law. SB24-148 regarding allowing certain facilities to use water detained in a storm water detention and infiltration facility for precipitation harvesting became law.

9. CWCB Update (15 min.)

 Jeff Rodriguez - 5 min. – The draft CWCB guide will be available in early June. An engage CWCB page will be set up for questions that don't get addressed in the guide. There will be a second year of the Transformative Landscape Change competition for utilities, etc. to transform up to 2000 ft. of landscaping. Resource Central website has the application online.

PEPO Committee (C. Davenhill) (5 min.) A PEPO Coordinators meeting for the State was held on May 3rd at the SPUR Campus. SPBRT/MRT had our display and materials at the meeting to share. SPBRT/MRT PEPO has been successful in helping get funding for the community of Hilldale Pines in Conifer for wildfire mitigation activities. We participated in the After the Flames conference in Estes Park. On May 18th the US Army Corp and Cherry Creek Stewardship Partners will be holding a "Be Dam Aware" event. Information will be shared with the MRT. We are participating with BizWest to plan a water related workshop that will be held on August 1st in Boulder. A new application to continue with PEPO work will be brought to the MRT in June. The Colorado Watershed Assembly is
