The area to be converted is approximately 40K sq. ft. and mostly consists of bluegrass that will entirely get eliminated and replaced with a mixture of native grasses, xeric shrub beds and plots of Tahoma 31 Bermuda Grass. The anticipated water savings are consistent with other conversion projects that we've pursued throughout the community since 2020.

Our agency is not the community's water and sanitation provider but we do work in concert with them and try to set the example for responsibly conserving water and using sustainable plant materials. Program Info

This project will involve the conversion of approximately 40,000 square feet of sloping parkway landscape which is mostly bluegrass. This project is part of the Metro District's Parkway Landscape

Conversion Program which is designed to reduce water consumption and maintenance by gradually converting strategic areas of the community's parkway landscape to more sustainable plant material. Several community partners have been involved with the program including the Highlands Ranch Community Association, South Metro Fire and Rescue and the Centennial Water and Sanitation District. Metro District staff are committed to the success of the program and, for this project in particular, intend to provide the following: Planning/design input, irrigation modifications, project oversight and future maintenance of the converted landscape including irrigation programming and tracking of consumption.
