Water Project Justification

SMWSA has long had the Water Ambassador program. The program started out small and worked primarily in after school programs of high schools. In recent years, the program shifted to vetted and trained educators who present engaging and hands-on lessons for students of all ages to learn and care about water. Through the distribution of conservation kits, students and families are given tangible resources to help them conserve water in easy ways! We want to encourage engagement within families and provide an understanding of our precious resource! This event will engage our community, and we hope through analysis and continued support that this may be an event that families and community members look forward to every year.
