Description						

The Ute Mountain Ute Tribe settled their federally reserved water rights with the state of Colorado in 1991 in cases W-1603-76F-H for existing and future uses. A portion of the Tribe's reserved water rights have yet to be put to beneficial use because of 1) lack of technology to track changes in use; 2) infrastructure and funding limitations for design and construction; 3) location and hydrologic feasibility not defined in the settlement. This project will investigate opportunities to use reserved rights for the economic benefit of Tribal members and includes:

an on-the-ground inventory and development of database to track existing well and stockpond use; a hydrologic and geotechnical analysis to identify potential reservoir sites for development of the reserved storage right in the Mancos River basin;

design of a diversion structure, pump station, and pipeline to deliver the San Juan River reserved water right to identified irrigated acreage near the Four Corners;

options to use the reserved irrigation right in the McElmo River basin;

investigation of opportunities to deliver their Dolores Project allocation of municipal and industrial water to the Four Corners region.

This study will not address the Tribe's reserved Animas-La Plata water rights.

Project is primarily a study, water supply and storage location for 21,000 AF reserved storage right will be investigated. Water supply study and feasibility for two reserved irrigation rights yet to be developed for 6,400 AF per year will be investigated.

#### **Water Project Justification**

The primary objective of this project is to track existing water use and identify options to develop the Tribe's federal reserved water rights within the Reservation boundary for the economic benefit of the Tribe and its members. The project meets several of the Water Plan objectives, fitting primarily in the Water Storage and Supply Project funding category. Development of additional reserved agricultural rights, especially the San Juan River right and storage in the Mancos River basin will provide long-term drought protection for the Ute Mountain Ute Farm and Ranch when there is reduced allocation from the Dolores Project. Opportunities to use the Tribe's reserved storage right in the Mancos will include investigation of environmental benefits in the severely depleted lower Mancos River.

In addition to clearly meeting Water Plan objectives, this project was a Basin Identified Project in the recent Southwest Basin Implementation Plans as follows:

"The Ute Mountain Ute Indian Tribe plans to seek funding to begin exploring options to develop the Tribe's unused Federal Reserved water rights for the benefit of the Tribal membership. As specific uses are identified as part of the study, separate projects will spin off for further analysis to include more detailed economic benefits, infrastructure needs, and marketing opportunities. These separate projects will then be included in future updates to the IPP database and may be included in more detail in future water availability analyses."
