Description

Trout Unlimited (TU) joins the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW), Foundation for Americas Public Lands (Foundation), American Whitewater (AW), and other partners to plan for and advance a roadmap for equitable, safe, and sustainable river recreation in Colorado. The proposed process will include the formation of a technical team, an analysis of gaps and opportunities, and engagement workshops to implement a comprehensive program to benefit Colorado's river recreation assets and address associated stewardship needs. We will engage stakeholders from communities across Colorado who are committed to thriving watersheds and the stewardship of Colorado's recreational rivers to co-create and help advance the

program into the future.

We propose this planning process alongside a request to Great Outdoors Colorado (GOCO) as the first step in the GOCO Centennial Program. Support from both the Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) and GOCO would ensure the success of this planning effort and allow partners to advance a new rivers-focused coalition to extend the initiative beyond the planning and visioning stage. This proposed process also leverages and builds on AW's CWCB-supported work to quantify recreational impacts and identify enhancement opportunities across Colorado's rivers, as well as various basin and watershed plans.
