Dear Mr. Wade and the Colorado Water Conservation Board,

Summary:

As part of the Integrated Watershed Management Planning efforts in the Middle Colorado River, the Bookcliff, South Side and Mount Sopris Conservation Districts undertook a ditch inventory to aid landowners in identifying projects, programs and best management practices that can be advanced to resolve, mitigate, or improve upon water-related gaps, infrastructure needs, habitat requirements or species-specific needs as well as providing information on potential funding mechanisms. As part of the project, the consumptive use group collaborated with the Middle Colorado Watershed Council to coalesce the consumptive and non-consumptive needs of the region. The end goal was to develop an Integrated Water Management Plan for the Middle Colorado River that included all water users.

The technical portion that we completed is Appendix H of the completed Integrated Water Management Plan. This covers the Consumptive use portion of the plan.

- Agricultural Production
- Municipal Water Supply
- **Industrial Processing and Resources Extraction**

This appendix was condensed "Middle Colorado River Agricultural Water Use Analysis and Infrastructure Assessment" covering:

- Background of History of Agriculture in the area
- Water Administration in the Middle Colorado
- Agricultural Infrastructure
- Agricultural Production
- Agricultural Water Storage
- IWMP Consumptive Use Goals, Objectives and Actions
 - Example: Kendig Reservoir to reduce agricultural shortages

The Consumptive Use appendix and adapted Agricultural Water Use Analysis and Infrastructure Assessment were then used in concurrence with work completed by the other advisory committees: Aquatic, Water Quality/Riparian and Recreational to create the final "Middle Colorado River Integrated Water Management Plan."

Beyond the writing of the plan the Bookcliff, Mount Sopris and South Side Conservation Districts also conducted outreach to engage water users and non-consumptive water users. This included a three part video service that covered:

- 1. Historical Water Use Practices and Efficiency Changes
- 2. Value of Cultivated Land and Open Space
- 3. Water Storage
 - a. Example Model: Kendig Reservoir

We were able to complete further outreach that included: Presenting and hosting at several local meetings based around Water Management Plans and Water Use and continued follow-up with implementing recommendations from the ditch inventory completed under POGGI 2018-1014. We were able to take our interactive stream trailer to local schools that viewed the video series and were able to model stream and irrigation system designs that could be tested with different flow rates.

Obstacles:

The timeline December of 2019 - June of 2022 of this grant saw lots of unknowns around the pandemic and changes in staffing with all organizations involved in completing the plan. This had a large impact on our ability to host events and complete the outreach portions of this grant. To help combat this, we shared our video series on as many platforms as available. We included the plan and appendix H in follow-up work with water users from our ditch inventory. We share the appendix and related work while administering programs we have including our Conservation Practice Cost share that provides technical assistance and funding for irrigation infrastructure improvements. This year several of these recommended treatments from the Ditch Inventories have been completed.

There were many challenges that arose with the changing in staffing with both our District Staff and Middle Colorado Water Council. Momentum on moving the plan forward was lost with each change as there was a 'catching up' on understanding of past work that was required inplace of moving work forward. This also led to some changes in approaches to the plan and an inevitable loss of understanding from not being involved at the start of the planning.

Budget:

The above obstacles had a large impact on the budgeting of this grant, the limits to our ability to complete outreach. Additionally, the changes in staffing slowed the momentum of work. This combination led to the overall project coming in far under budget. However, the Project Objectives were completed.

Project Objectives:

- 1. Conduct and attend focus group meetings with municipal, industrial, agricultural, and the IWMP Advisory Committee. In addition, a series of short videos on agricultural practices will be developed.
- 2. Drafting of the Integrated Watershed Management Plan for consumptive uses in the Region including background research and plan documents. Incorporate findings from the ditch assessment to improve State planning models.
- 3. Review documentation and seek to improve the newly releases Surface Water Supply Initiative models with information gathered during the ditch inventory.
- 4. Interaction and collaboration with non-consumptive users in the Region for purposes of coalescing the IWMP.
- 5. Educational roll-out for focus groups and other groups developing integrated watershed management plans across the State.

The Statement of Work and tasks, considering the limits on outreach are completed. There has been a push as COVID Protocols have freed up to increase outreach. This led to the board of supervisors of all three districts voting to return the unused money in place of seeking permission to expand the scope of work. Per emails with the grant administrator the change in budget used was met with a one to one match. See attached spreadsheet of cash and in kind matches. Also included with this final report is a breakdown of the tasks and associated proof of work that meet the required deliverables.

In Conclusion:

This grant allowed us to further the work completed under the Colorado Water Conservation Board's Water Supply Reserve Fund Grant. In spite of the challenges and unused budget the final Middle Colorado Integrated Water Management Plan is complete and is a living document. Our work to complete the Consumptive Use portion and the condensed "Middle Colorado River Agricultural Water Use Analysis and Infrastructure Assessment" has lead to outreach that will continue past the grant and will further our ability to meet our goal through existing and new programs of providing technical and financial assistance to land and water users to help preserve our natural resources.

Work on Task 3 - SWSI Modeling had to shift considering that meeting with landowners to review acreage reports was not possible with pandemic shut downs and protocols. The work completed under this task shifted from reviewing acreage reports to looking at different scenarios of stream flows and where there would be shortages. We also looked at Bulk Water Hauling sales from the water stations in three municipalities. This work was included in the final Integrated Water Management plan and helped tie in other Consumptive Use beyond agriculture.
