Description

This will be a three-phase project with an overall goal to reduce water consumption on state owned land. This project is intended to be applied to all state-owned irrigated land.

Phase 1: Conduct QWEL training for landscape professionals maintaining state owned land. Phase 2: Conduct a certain number of irrigation audits on state owned land. The target would be irrigation audits on 5 of the largest owned pieces of irrigated land. For example, the following locations:

- State Capitol/Capitol Complex: 2.3 M sq ft
- DHS Mental Health Facility Pueblo: 2.29 M sq ft
- Arkansas Valley Correctional Facility: 487,872 sq ft
- Sterling Correctional Facility: 400,752 sq ft
- DPA 1881 Pierce: 407,732 sq ft

Phase 3: Implement upgrades and changes from irrigation audits

This specific grant is tailored to phase 1 and phase 2 of this project. Based on the results from phase 2, a budget will be built out for phase 3

Water Project Justification

This water project will ultimately contribute to the goals of the Colorado Water Plan and address the efficiency of state-owned irrigation systems (

https://dnrweblink.state.co.us/CWCB/0/edoc/219188/Colorado_WaterPlan_2023_Digital.pdf_PDF pg. 30).

Additionally, this project will impact multiple basins as the intention is to conduct irrigation audits and improvements at state owned land throughout the entire State. For example, the State Capitol sits within the South Platte Basin and the Colorado Mental Health Facility in Pueblo sits in the Arkansas River basin. The South Platte River Implementation Plan, PDF pg. 11 (

The Arkansas River Basin Implementation plan mentions a goal of "support regional efforts for cost-effective"

solutions to local water supply gaps" in pdf pg. 14 (https://dnrweblink.state.co.us/cwcbsearch/0/edoc/216704/Arkansas_BIP_Volume1_2022.pdfs).

Training state employees on QWEL and equipping them with the skills they need to conduct irrigation audits will not only contribute to protecting Colorado's water resources but result in less water use by the State overall.
