Dear Colorado Water Conservation Board Members:

The Colorado River Outfitters Association (CROA) strongly supports the permanent protection of the Shoshone Water Rights and urges the Colorado Water Conservation Board to accept the use of the Shoshone Water Rights for instream flow purposes.

CROA is a trade association representing 44 river outfitters, many of whom raft and fish the Colorado River from Gore Canyon to the Colorado-Utah border. To run an outfitting business, operators depend on predictable flows to sell and run outings. The Shoshone water rights help ensure predictable flows. The Shoshone Hydro Plant has some of the largest, most senior nonconsumptive water rights on the Colorado River. These rights ensure essential water flows down the Colorado River's mainstem, providing vital ecosystem, habitat, and restoration benefits from the river's headwaters in Grand County to Grand Junction.

Without the Shoshone water rights, Colorado River flows would be significantly lower, (especially in drought years), diminishing over 250 miles of connected ecosystems that rely on the river's flows to support Gold Medal fisheries and critical habitat for native, threatened, and endangered fish.

These water rights are vital to Colorado's agricultural and recreation economies, which support thriving Western Slope communities. Additionally, Shoshone flows improve drinking water quality by diluting salinity and sediment in the source water, reducing municipal treatment and infrastructure costs.

The Shoshone Water Rights Preservation Coalition represents a broad, diverse, and long-standing alliance between local partners, the Colorado River District, irrigation entities, environmental and recreation interests, and the State of Colorado. To date, the coalition has raised over \$57 million towards the \$99 million purchase price underscoring the critical importance of this resource to the region. Over thirty water entities, local governments, and regional partners have contributed over

\$15 million in funding alongside \$20 million each from the State of Colorado and the Colorado River District. The Colorado River Outfitters Association strongly supports the Colorado River District's efforts to permanently secure the Shoshone water rights. I have already seen detrimental changes to the environment during low water years due to the trans-mountain diversions from the Blue and Upper Colorado. Some examples I see are keystone species dying from water levels dropping top fast, invertebrates life cycles out of balance due to unnatural flows, and algae growth due to unnatural River temperatures. In fact I have committed that are on the edge of not having enough drinking water currently due to low flows in the Blue River this spring.

Protecting Colorado River flows should be the top priority of our state. More than just loosing the most important River in the west, my communities would see an immeasurable financial impact due to how tied our tourist economy is with the natural resource of the river.
