Project Update:

Task 1 – Venues

The Arkansas River Basin Water Forum (ARBWF) welcomed 231 attendees at the 2024 Forum (Attendance sheets are attached). The ARBWF required one large banquet room to accommodate keynote and plenary sessions and lunch. We also utilized the College's theater for concurrent sessions and a large conference room as an exhibitors' space. The cost for the three Otero College spaces totaled \$1400.

The Local Leaders Dinner Reception was held at Inspiration Field on the evening before the first day of the Forum, Tuesday, March 5, 2024. We had 128 local and statewide policy and decision makers attend. Senator Cleave Simpson planned to be our Keynote Speaker but had to cancel at the last minute. As a replacement, CWCB Board Chair and Chaffee County Commissioner, Greg Felt, stepped up and did a fantastic job as our evening Keynote. The ARBWF also used Inspiration Field to host the Percolation and Runoff Networking dinner. We had 143 people attend. The cost to rent Inspiration Field for the two dinners comes to \$2846.65.

The ARBWF hosted a water-related tour of Bents Old Fort. The Fort required a fee of \$10 per person. We had 36 people attend the tour and paid \$360 for the tour. Total cost for this task is \$4606.65. ARBWF is requesting \$3224.66 in reimbursement for Task1. The cash match amounts to \$1382.00.

Task 2 – Catering

The final guaranteed numbers for catering the 2024 educational and outreach events follows:

4. Thursday, March 7th, Otero College, Morning and Break Refreshments and Lunches – 250 attendees

The ARBWF paid \$6774 to Sweet Inspiration Catering for the Local Leaders and Percolation and Runoff Dinners. In addition, ARBWF paid \$17061.49 for catering to Otero College. The total cost for Task 2 is \$23835.49. ARBWF is requesting \$16684.84 in reimbursement. The cash match amounts to \$7150.65.

Task 3 – Program Management

ARBWF Program Manager, Jean Van Pelt, performed and successfully delivered the task deliverables, on-time, on-budget and satisfactorily according to the ARBWF Board of Directors expectations.

Ms. Van Pelt's services for the months of January, February, and March amounted to \$14710. The January invoice #56 was \$4210, February invoice #57 was \$6680 and March invoice #58 was \$3820.

The ARBWF Planning Committee met monthly from August through the end of March to plan the 2024 Water Forum (A Planning committee Time Tracker worksheet is attached). There was a total of 43 members with many being very active by attending each meeting and volunteering for leadership roles during the planning process and the forum itself. Their volunteer hours amounted to 1,083 hours. Placing a \$30 per hour value on their time amounts to \$32,490 as an in-kind match.

Total cost for Task 3 is \$14,710. ARBWF is requesting \$14,710 in reimbursement for Task 3.

Task 4 – Infographic and program design and printing

Colorado Springs Utilities' graphic designer and planning committee member, Lisa Pace designed the infographic. They spent 30 in-kind hours at \$30 an hour creating the infographic for an in-kind match amount of \$900. Colorado Springs Utilities also printed 400 copies of the infographic for a cash match of \$2000. The infographic was distributed at the Local Leaders Dinner Reception and the two-day forum. The remaining copies of the infographic were provided to the Purgatoire River Watershed Partnership, Lower Arkansas Valley Water Conservancy District, and the Arkansas River Conservation Cooperative to aid them in their water education and outreach efforts.

Jessica Mills, an ARBWF Planning Committee member, spent 30 hours at \$30 an hour creating the program for an in-kind match of \$900. Colorado Springs Utilities printed 300 copies of the program for distribution at the Forum for a cash match of \$1000.

The infographic and programs are attached. There were no costs associated with this task and reimbursement is not required.

Task 5 – Tour Transportation

ARBWF did not incur any costs for tour transportation because there is not a service in the lower Arkansas River valley that provides transportation services. The tour attendees carpooled to the tour locations.

Beyond Borders: A Cross-Basin Exploration for Water Preservation Strategies

Some Colorado communities have already experienced the damaging effects of dried-up land and struggling economies due to water exports. By 2050, Colorado could lose an additional 1,000 square miles of irrigated farmland now used for food production to meet demands from population growth along the Front Range. During this on-stage conversation, we will hear from presenters from the South Platte Basin, the San Luis Valley, and the Arkansas River Basin, who will discuss commonalities, differences, and solutions for water preservation strategies that help retain this essential economic building block locally for generations to come.

This informative and engaging panel conversation will explore regulatory, policy, and engagement strategies that seek to reduce outside pressures on local water supplies to support a thriving agriculture environment, vibrant economies, and a healthy ecosystem in the regions where water has historically been put to beneficial use.

Groundwater Augmentation in the Arkansas River Basin - Past, Present, and Future

Location: Grand Ballroom

Augmentation of tributary groundwater has been an evolving part of water management in the Arkansas Basin for the last half century. Beginning with the advent of both the Arkansas River Compact and the centrifugal pump, which both arrived on the scene at around the same time, the State of Colorado and the Arkansas Basin have faced challenges around the use and administration of tributary groundwater. Tributary groundwater is defined as those waters that reside below the ground, but which are hydraulically linked to surface waters. The panels will begin by discussing the 1969 Water Rights Determination Act, the Compact and the Kansas v. Colorado lawsuit. Included in the presentation will be the important components of water use and management in the basin, the history of well usage, the organizations that have been responsible for overseeing and managing tributary wells, the key events that have shaped well augmentation over the years, and what the future may hold for well users in the Arkansas Basin.

Since the formation of the state of Colorado in 1876 to present day, Colorado water law continues to recognize fundamental principles regarding the use of water in our state: public water ownership, anti-speculation, beneficial use, and priority administration. The presentation will briefly touch on Colorado's Constitution and the early codification of the adjudication and administrative laws before turning to the Water Right and Administration Act of 1969. In focusing on the 1969 Act, statutorily defined terms such as "appropriation", "beneficial use," "change of water right", and "plans for augmentation" will be discussed, as well as the 1969 Act's requirements regarding water court applications and notice provisions.

Colorado's interstate compacts provide an overlay on the basic tenets of water law. The presentation will discuss the specifics of the Arkansas River Compact, the litigation with Kansas that began in 1985, and the current challenges in administering the Compact.

AFTERNOON TOURS*Partnering for Fountain Creek - Restoration, Maintenance, and Data Collection Tour***Location: Confluence Park is located at the junction of Hwy 227 (S. Lacrosse Ave.) and Stockyard Road on Pueblo's east side. The Park is north of the Arkansas River**

This tour will encompass many facets of collaborative efforts to protect and enhance Fountain Creek in Pueblo. The tour will begin with a short indoor presentation on the aquatic nuisance species detected in the region. Participants will then load into personal or carpool vehicles and head to Confluence Park. Hear about the historical importance of this area and planned improvements for signage along the creek. Learn about the Division of Water Resources gauge station, equipment, and data collection on the banks of the Fountain. Follow the recreational trail to view the Fountain Creek Watershed District's creek restoration work including management of invasive species. Then a short walk down the trail leads to Fountain Lake for the final stop. Takeaways for this tour include aquatic nuisance species identification and monitoring, historical aspects of the park, and restoration to improve recreation.

Participants are asked to wear sturdy shoes for a short walk and to dress for our varied Colorado springtime weather. There is no restroom available at Confluence Park.

The proposed El Paso County Regional Indirect Potable Reuse Project would leverage existing and planned infrastructure to divert physically and legally available water from Fountain Creek, treat it, and get it back to water providers through the county. Regional Resource Planning Group Total Dissolved Solids Data Dashboard

Location: Grand Ballroom

The objective of this presentation is to build upon RRPg's previous ARBWF presentation in 2024 and give a guided tour of the data dashboard.

RRPG was established to identify regional opportunities to implement plans and to safeguard, preserve and develop for present and future generations the water available for diversion and use within the Arkansas River Basin. The RRPg has developed an on-line dashboard to provide "real-time" data regarding current water quality conditions throughout much of the Arkansas River. The dashboard will be demonstrated during this presentation.

The dashboard allows water users to observe when water quality conditions deviate from historical conditions and support decisions regarding the potential uses of water. The continuous data also informs water managers of changes in water quality that could possibly correlate to different operations, uses, and flow conditions.

Mountain Precipitation & Water Supply Outlooks

Location: Ballroom C

In addition to short-term climate monitoring and forecasting, the National Weather Service models and analyzes long-term climate and precipitation trends. While forecasting precipitation for the mountains of Colorado on seasonal and longer-term scales remains a challenge, recent advancements in the analysis of global climate teleconnection patterns have improved our forecasting capabilities including for intraseasonal variations in mountain precipitation. The National Weather Service also relies on past and current climatological and hydrologic data for hydrologic modelling and water supply forecasting efforts. Improvement in water supply forecasting accuracy has been achieved with the additional incorporation of forecasted precipitation and runoff into the modelling process. Recent advancements in the identification of intraseasonal variations in forecasted precipitation and climatological conditions may provide another opportunity to further enhance water supply forecasting efforts.

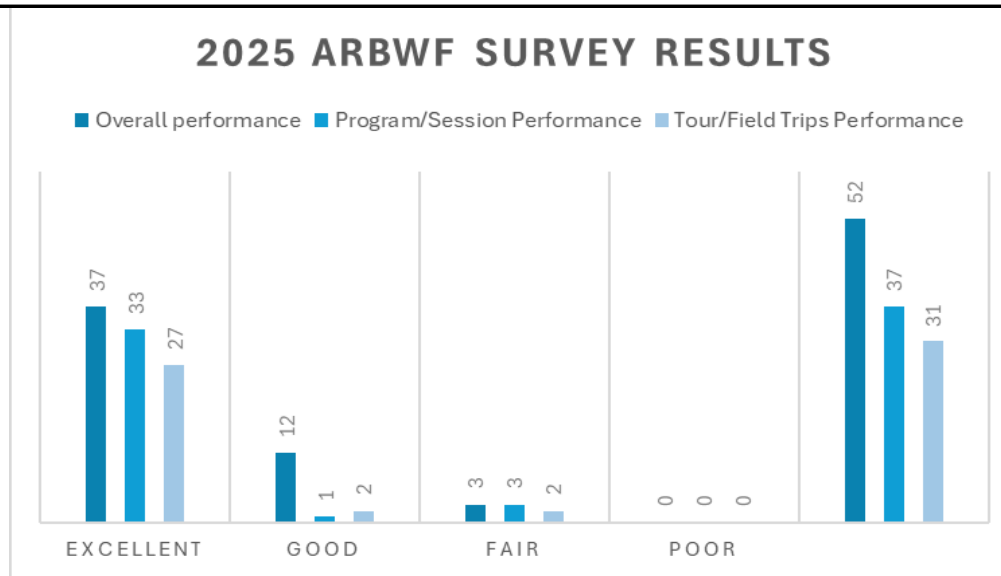
