#### Background:

For this agenda item, the Board is provided with a brief overview of applications to the Water Supply Reserve Fund (WSRF). Attachments to this memo include:

Staff's review of the applications involves the following steps:



LOCATION

The Fort Bent Ditch Company, which serves 70 shareholders in Bent and Prowers Counties, manages the Fort Bent Ditch. This ditch provides direct flow irrigation water using six direct flow water rights and also delivers water from John Martin Reservoir. Additionally, it helps convey Fryingpan-Arkansas Project water to the City of Lamar for the Clay Creek Recharge facility. The ditch diverts water from the Arkansas River and irrigates approximately 5,870 acres.

Late in the 2024 irrigation season, a small leak was found in a siphon crossing where the ditch water flows underground beneath Willow Creek and a main road to the Prowers Medical Center in the City of Lamar. A contractor repaired this section in early 2025, but further inspections revealed that more repairs were needed.

WSRF funds will be used for engineering and construction costs. The Company secured a CWCB loan in March 2025 for a significant portion of the project and is now seeking supplemental WSRF grant funding to help reduce the long-term financial burden on its shareholders.

The project aligns with the Arkansas Basin Implementation Plan goal of repairing aging infrastructure and preserving critical agricultural and municipal water supplies in Bent County and Prowers County.

Issues/Additional Needs: No issues or additional needs have been identified.

Funding Recommendation: Staff recommends approval of up to \$110,502 from the Arkansas Basin Account.

<b>Basin:</b> Southwest

The City of Durango is a community of approximately 20,000 residents located in La Plata County in southwestern Colorado. The City's primary source of drinking water is from the Florida River but the City also has in-flow water rights from the Animas River. The city does not have significant water storage to rely on. Approximately 45% of Durango's water consumption is indoor use, with 55% being used for outdoor irrigation.

A nine-mile pipeline, originally built in the early 1900s and reconstructed in the 1950s, carries this water to the College Mesa Water Treatment Plant. This pipeline is now over 70 years old and has experienced several breaks, causing interruptions to the water supply for up to three weeks at a time.

To address this, a new pipeline will be designed and installed alongside the existing one, requiring the verification and acquisition of necessary easements and rights-of-way. Once the new pipeline is operational, the old one will be taken offline for a rehabilitation assessment. It will then either be rehabilitated or replaced, ultimately providing the City of Durango with two fully redundant pipelines for its primary drinking water source. The WSRF grant will be used for design and engineering.

Issues/Additional Needs: The city is a covered entity as defined in Colorado Revised Statutes 37-60-126(1)(b), but does not have an approved Water Efficiency Plan (WEP) on file nor have they submitted required HB10-1051 reporting to CWCB. However, the city is actively working to complete a new WEP and 1051 reporting. WSRF funds cannot be released until a WEP has reached at least conditional approval. Staff would proceed with grant contracting on a condition in the grant agreement that grant funds cannot be reimbursed until the WEP has received at least conditional approval and 1051 reporting has been submitted. No other issues or additional needs have been identified.

Funding Recommendation: Staff recommends approval of up to \$100,000 from the Southwest Basin Account. Project approval is contingent upon the applicants' abilities to resolve issues and additional needs identified by staff.
