Dear Mr. Butters and Mr. Williams:

On October 7, 2013, the Division received a correspondence from Mr. Williams, dated October 1, 2013, regarding the potential transfer of rock materials from the Revenue Mine, Permit M-2011-032, to the permit area of the Camp Bird Mine. Copy of the correspondence is enclosed.

Please note such request must be made by the permit holder of the Camp Bird Mine, must provide the information required under Hard Rock Rule 3.1.5(9), and must be submitted for Division review and approval through the Technical Revision process described under Rules 1.1(52) and 1.9. Additionally, given the status of the Revenue Mine as a Designated Mine Operation, the Division may require the certification, required under Rule 3.1.5(9)(c), be supported by appropriate laboratory analysis which demonstrates that the proposed imported materials are clean and inert, as defined under Rule 1.1(24); are not acid or toxic producing, as defined under Rule 1.1(1); and will not generate acid mine drainage, as defined under Rule 1.1(2).

The request from Mr. Williams, dated October 1, 2013, does not satisfy the above itemized requirements and is denied. If the permit holder of the Camp Bird Mine desires to import fill materials generated from off-site areas, please submit an appropriate request addressing the requirements described herein.


