COMMENTS

This was a partial inspection of the Elk Creek Mine conducted by Brock Bowles and Sandra Brown of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining & Safety. Jim Kiger of Oxbow Mining, LLC was present for the inspection. The weather was overcast and the ground was dry.

The Northeast Main mine seals remain sealed and it has been determined by Oxbow Mining, LLC that they will not be able to retreive the longwall miner. The remainder of Panel 18 and all of Panel 19 is being abandoned. Oxbow continues the deveopment work in the new east lease area and is working with the Forest Service and BLM for a mine plan modification for an area north of the current east lease area. Oxbow is also working with the BLM for a lease modification to ramp down to the B-Seam and mine the coal behind the old Somerset Mine that is still within the current permit boundary. The Federal Government is shut down right now so the lease modifications are on hold.

AIR RESOURCE PROTECTION - Rule 4.17:

A coal train was being loaded during this inspection. Coal was not being stacked but a hot spot in the coal pile was being treated by a dozer and water hose. There were no signs of fugitive dust on site or off.

FISH and WILDLIFE - Rule 4.18:

A red-tailed hawk was seen on the Bear Creek Road with a squirrel in its talons that eventually got away. The hawk flew back into the trees in pursuit of the squirrel.

Ponds A, B and East Yard contained water but none were discharging. Ponds F (photo 1) and Hubbard Creek (photo 2) were dry and the outfalls were free and clear of debris. The pond cleanings that were drying in the East Yard pond reported in the August 6, 2013 report had been removed.

Number of <u>Partial</u> Inspection this Fiscal Year: 5 Number of Complete Inspections this Fiscal Year: 1 Water was not being discharged from the temporary discharge point 015B. Since the longwall miner recovery efforts have ceased, the pumps were turned off. Most of the equipment on the well pad had been removed. Some water remained in the small pond below the pad but all the other areas appeared to be dry (photo 3). Equipment was being moved to the pad-site to remove the pumps before winter. It is estimated that the pad will be reclaimed next year. The sediment control waddles around the base of the well pad need to be re-installed. Some of the stakes have pulled out and the waddles were not in contact with the soil surface.

The Bear Creek and Hubbard Creek Roads were well maintained and passable. The light use roads up to the 015B discharge well pad were passable. The access roads around the mine facilities area were well maintained.
