OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety. The 23 Road Pit is located 3 miles west of Grand Junction, Colorado off of River Road. The site is a 112c operation. The focus of the inspection was to assess the reclamation at the site and determine if the acreage reduction request was approvable. Gayle Lyman of Grand Junction Concrete Pipe Company accompanied the inspector during the inspection.

The mine identification sign and the affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with rule 3.1.12. The sign is located on a post at the main entrance on the North side of the gravel mine. The permit boundaries are comprised of fences and markers that are easily identifiable around the entire perimeter of the mine.

On July 15, 2013 a technical revision (TR-5) was approved modifying the reclamation plan. The revision of the reclamation plan incorporated the existing office / precast facility, the existing bike path, the existing cell phone tower, a precast product storage facility and a construction materials sale and storage area.

On August 8, 2013 the operator requested to release 57 acres and reduce the permit acreage from 139 acres to 82 acres. The 57 acres requested for release included the areas addressed in TR-5 that was approved on July 15, 2013 and the lake located at the southwest corner of the permit area which has been determined to be a "prelaw" disturbance.

The 57 acres was inspected and found to meet the requirements of the approved reclamation plan.

No problems or violations were noted or observed during the September 26, 2013 inspection.
